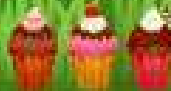

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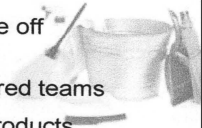
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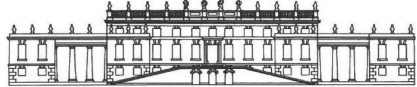
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THE CHURCHYARD

CAN YOU HELP? We are dividing the churchyard up into smaller and more manageable areas. For example the area around the Church door will be kept well mown all the year around.

The north side around the Percy Cross **may** become the wildlife area with the sowing of wildflowers. This area will then have to be cut/scythed or strimmed in August. Pathways will be mown around the churchyard perhaps following the Churchyard trail. The East end to be mown regularly; in the spring areas which have snowdrops, daffodils and other bulbs will be left until mid June and then cut and the grass cleared away. The areas of the modern graves are often looked after by some families and those unattended will be an area where we need volunteers.

Welcome to the May update from your Parish Council.

On behalf of the Parish Council we would like to extend our condolences on the passing of HRH Prince Phillip, Duke of Edinburgh on the 9th April.

PARISH COUNCIL VACANCY : The vacancy still remains open and we intend to look to recruit in a few months time when hopefully we can meet face to face. We are looking for someone who not only has good ideas but is also able to help make them become reality.

SENIOR CITIZEN CENTRE : Approval was given to move to the Building Regulations and Tender stage, once this is complete we will be ready to begin the redevelopment. The new centre will be available for multi use and as such we will be looking to rename the new building, Cllrs Richards has agreed to liaise with the school for name suggestions to be put forward.

HIGHWAYS / SPEEDING / PARKING : The supplier of the mobile SID has been decided and this will be ordered shortly and we are grateful for the help of Clifford PC. The 2nd SID should be installed towards the end of May.

ASSETS AND AMENITIES :

The Assets Development Working Group terms of reference were agreed and as such this group will meet shortly to consider the bigger picture plan for the village taking into consideration the Neighborhood Plan and residents' views. Contributions from the community will be encouraged through open meetings.

It was agreed that the adult gym equipment could reopen.

WILDLIFE AREA : We are still awaiting a visit from LCC to hopefully approve the proposed tree works hoping to carry out this work in the coming weeks. Once this is carried out we will agree a plan for the management of this area in combination with the development of the new building.

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We send our very best wishes to Anne Topping who left the village last month.

She and Paul were driving through Bramham and thought it a nice place so looked into buying a plot of land which they did. Paul drew the plans and they had their house built. They came from Cleckheaton where she taught English and sport at the grammar school. (She taught Yvonne Gibson which is quite a coincidence they both ended up in the same village) They had four children two of each and when the children were at school Anne taught English at Thorpe Arch prison to fit in with school hours. Anne was involved with the Brownies helping Gladys Horsley to run the pack. She was a member of the Bramham Women's Institute and when it became the Yorkshire Country Women's Association she eventually became the chairman a position she held until the closure of the branch due to Corona virus in the Spring of 2020.



Anne and Paul learned bell ringing in Thorner and joined a group in Bramham and rang at a number of local churches for weddings. They also helped at on a voluntary basis at Leversham with the North York's railway. They were active members of the community until Paul had a serious stroke from which he eventually died. Anne carried on with the YCA and joined the Keep Fit classes run by Yvonne Gibson in the village hall. With the coming of the virus and the isolation she decided to move to a flat near her daughter Clare in Shropshire. We are sad to lose a valued member of our community and wish her all the best in this new phase of her life.

Volunteer Litter Picking Group

Bramham's volunteer litter pickers have continued to be busy in and around the village. During March we removed 105 bags of litter, as well as many various parts of cars and other random items, from our roadside verges and paths. THANK YOU to all the volunteers.

Numerous volunteers over many days and weeks have removed bags and bags of historic litter from West Woods Road. Hopefully, you've spotted it is looking much improved and the removal of litter louts' tossings will be easier to maintain going forward.

Other focus areas have been and continue to be Paradise Way – in particular there is one dreadful grot spot of embedded years' worth of litter strewn from the A1 – together with Thorner Road up to Wothersome Woods and Toulston Road (including clearing the heavily fly tipped layby).

There's no fixed commitment, you just go out when you can. Sometimes a few volunteers go out together in a socially-distanced safe way. The benefits to you are great – you make a clearly visible improvement to your neighbourhood – you can see it with your own eyes. Plus, it's out in the fresh air, good exercise and you feel part of a team.

During March and April, we have had families and small groups of children undertaking litter picking too – often safely focusing on the cycle paths.

We would love to encourage more families to head out for an hour's litter picking. It's a wonderful means of educating children on the need to not drop litter.

We still have some dates to go – this month, on May 17th, we see ourselves in groups of up to 30, such crowds! And then to eat **inside** at a restaurant or café! Put away the thermal vests and fingerless gloves.

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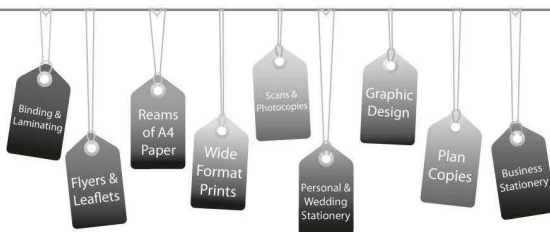

GOVERNOR VACANCY About the Schools



Bramham & Shadwell is a successful Federation, led by our Executive Head Teacher, Sarah Richards. Just a few miles apart, the schools work effectively together to deliver a high standard of education for the children at both sites.

Bramham Primary is a fantastic local primary school and has been rated by Ofsted as Good with Outstanding Early Years provision and personal development behaviour and welfare. Bramham, once a school of 35 children and facing closure is now a thriving and ever-expanding school, with full cohorts in the majority of year groups; it has become a most sought after primary school in the area, with over 90 applications this year for the Reception cohort of September 2021.

Shadwell Primary has been rated Ofsted Outstanding for many years; receiving plaudits for its Outstanding attainment, leadership, management and governance. It benefits from a full cohort in each year group and is highly sought after, again with waiting lists to join throughout the local area.

After a long period of stability, the Federation's Governing Body is looking to appoint a number of governors to help continue to guide the Federation on its journey of on-going improvement in their vision of *Excellence for All*.

What do Governors actually do? Governors are responsible for the strategic vision and financial management of the Federation, as well as holding the Head Teacher to account. They enable their schools to run as effectively as possible; work alongside Senior Leaders and support teachers to provide the highest possible standard of education to children. The commitment of an individual governor is to consider issues, such as setting the school vision, mitigating financial risk, and scrutinising educational outcomes. They are also involved in the school community; acting as critical friends to the Head Teacher and Senior Leaders.

Working as a team with other governors and the Federation's leadership team, the Governing Body will set the strategic direction, create robust accountability, and ensure financial probity. The Governors do not run the school on a day-to-day basis, but provide independent and strategic oversight of the management and operation of the school. An individual governor will do this by attending Governing Body meetings, attending school to conduct monitoring and evaluating visits, attending committee meetings and in preparing questions for Senior Leaders, following reading and scrutinising documents and paperwork prior to meetings.

Why should I become a Governor?

Being a Governor is a chance to experience leadership at board level at any point in one's personal career. The role provides individuals with the opportunity to develop one's skills, such as negotiation, influencing and teamwork. The role is perfect for professionals looking to improve their business and leadership skills whilst helping society and enhancing children's futures.

You will be offered fabulous training opportunities (via high quality e-learning and face-to-face courses), regularly scheduled business governor networking sessions and, of course, the support of our existing team.

What's involved? A term of office is 4 years but many of the current Governing Body have been members for much longer than this. Visiting the school (when restrictions allow) is a must in order to get to know the staff, meet the children, and see how the schools operate. There will be a minimum of 3 Full Governing Body and 3 committee meetings per year, preparation for these meetings will be another 4 - 5 hours. In addition, Governors often get involved in sub-committees and wider school life. Meetings are held during working hours in the day to ensure school staff (and sometimes children) can participate.

Our Current Vacancies We are looking for committed people to join the Governing Body of the Bramham & Shadwell Federation.

We would welcome applications from people from any walk of life - all we ask for is an interest and commitment to the schools and the welfare of our pupils, along with your time and a willingness to get involved.

The recruitment process requires you to complete an application form, a skills audit by the Governing Body and an interview with representatives from the Governing Body.

If you would like to find out more about how you can contribute to governance at our Federation, would like an application form or have any questions about anything, then please contact reception staff at either school who will then arrange for a Governor to contact you.
