CONNECTIONS CAFE

One way in which our churches are building back better after the upheaval of the past couple of years in by developing our ministry among adults in their 20s, 30s and 40s. Joanna Davies has been appointed as our new Connections Minister as part of the Diocese of York's Multiply project. (see picture below) Jo grew up in these villages, was a chorister at St Mary's, Boston Spa in her youth, got married there, and her children attend Lady Elizabeth Hastings School in Thorp Arch. As Connections Minister, Jo will develop the way our churches serve other parents of local children, and young professionals without children. This builds on our churches' existing work with parents of babies and toddlers via The Ark (run for the last 17 years by the Mothers' Union), and our more recent Faith At Work group which serves younger professionals in our villages.

The focal point of Jo's work will be growing a new worshipping community on Saturday mornings, centred around Connections Cafe. The cafe runs weekly from 10am to noon at St Mary's, Boston Spa and features delicious, fresh Fairtrade coffee and homemade cakes, served with love and a smile, and the cafe operates on a "Pay as You Feel" basis, and there is an informal faith slot - a pause for thought - around 11am each week. Everyone is welcome, whatever their age, but our intention is that this offers a different time and place to "do church" for those who find Sunday mornings just don't work for their household. Why not pop along to see how Connections Cafe is coming along on Saturdays 10am - 12noon.

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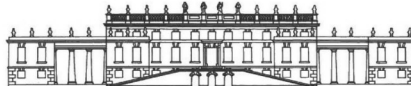

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**Welcome to the October update
from your Parish Council**

Welcome to the December update from your Parish Council.

CRIME REPORT: PC Tom Goringe attended the November PACT meeting held at Wetherby Methodist Church. The good news is that overall, the crime figures are still down, with the only rise happening in incidents of public order where those involved were known to each other.

In view of the oncoming darker nights, Police advice was to keep car keys away from front doors to deter thieves from using technology to activate them. They also recommended looking at the Easy Street Campaign which highlights the ways in which householders can limit the ease with which potential burglaries can occur. This advice is on Social Media.

It was reported that the Travellers have left the Ings in Wetherby, and the Police eviction powers were explained. These depend on proving public nuisance, so as with all instances of behaviour which, causes resident concern, the Police urged all concerns to be reported to the Police This can be done online or by ringing 101 if it is not an emergency. If it is not reported, it cannot be actioned

HIGHWAYS / SPEEDING / PARKING:

Highways work at Bramham School:

It has long been felt that the pedestrian approach to Bramham school, from Bramham and particularly Clifford was not as safe as it could be.

The narrow pavements and bend in the road create a potentially dangerous situation for pedestrians, especially children.

LCC Highways have now agreed to widen the pavements in both directions, with a new entrance to the school coming from the Clifford side to enable children to access school grounds quicker and avoid the walk alongside the road.

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A meeting with Highways and the School investigated various options recently and final plans are due to be produced in the next few weeks.

Parking Around the War Memorial

Highways have visited the War Memorial Site and have created a potential plan for amending the vehicular access to, and traffic flow around the area. They have also looked at ways to limit parking in the vicinity of the memorial.

These plans will be available to view on the **24th November at the Traffic Management Public Meeting at 7 pm in the Pavilion**, as will the proposed works at Bramham Primary School.

Traffic Management Working Group:.. The open meeting scheduled for 24 November will be attended by members of the group together with representatives from Leeds City Council Highways Department. I would like to thank Councilors Mike Corrigan, Linda Richards and Scott Jones, together with the residents who have taken part in the speed monitoring sessions. However, unless more volunteers are forthcoming, sustaining these sessions will be difficult. Please visit the Council's website for the Group's minutes and other information.

SENIOR CITIZENS CENTRE DEVELOPMENT PLAN (SCC):

A webpage with many documents and photographs related to the SCC has been created for residents. The Information Board in the SCC garden has been created with plans of the proposed development. COVID has not only delayed the project but the subsequent rise in costs has meant that the Architects have been asked to provide up to date potential costings to enable a more meaningful costing of a future build.

Following a deep clean the SCC has been reopened for public use. Many thanks to Councilors Pam Corrigan, Linda Richards and Helena Buck.

PAVILION/PLAYING FIELD: At the time the Pavilion was built a CCTV system was installed but has never been in operation. The Council has now agreed to have the system checked with a view to the system becoming operational as soon as possible. The cost of installing WI – Fi is also to be explored.

Residents may recall that following the Traveller incursion, a leak from the gas pipe which circuits the playing field was discovered. It appears that there are no plans available which show the location of the utility/drainage services. The Council is obtaining quotes for a survey of the playing field to determine the location, in order to prevent further damage to the services and avoid potential risk to users of the Pavilion/Playing Field.

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CIL PAYMENT: Leeds City Council has advised that following the completion of the 2 properties on Aberford Road, the Parish Council should shortly receive a CIL payment of £ 9023. The receipt will form part of the Council's budget planning for 2022/23.

PARISH MAGAZINE: The Council is pleased to announce that the Parish Magazine will be posted as a news item on the Council's website.

NEXT MEETING: The next meeting will take place at **7pm on Wednesday 1 December 2021** and will be held **in the Pavilion**.

Bramham Community Fund

The Bramham Community Fund exists to distribute the money generated by Festival Republic from the sale of residents' tickets at the Leeds Festival together with other donations made directly by the promoter. The requirement is that funds are to be used for the benefit of the community of Bramham. Since the Leeds Festival moved to Bramham in 2003, the Fund has allocated grants to a value of over £410,000.

The last allocation of grants, took place in March 2021. It is planned that the allocations from the 2021 Festival will be considered in March 2022. The Fund is therefore now inviting applications.

The closing date is 14 February 2022.

To keep it simple, there is no formal application form. Just write to the Bramham Community Fund c/o Colin Pool at 7 Prospect Bank, Bramham, LS23 6RS or send an email to colin.pool@empiconsulting.co.uk saying what you would like a grant for, how much and why. The Fund committee under the chairmanship of Nick Lane Fox will then meet to consider the applications.

Proposed projects should normally be completed within one year of the grant being awarded. If a project is expected to exceed that timescale, the application should indicate as such.

You should be aware that in the past preference in the allocation of grants has been given to new projects rather than funding the ongoing support of existing activities.

Applications cannot be accepted from individuals, commercial organisations or for projects which do not directly benefit residents of Bramham.

CLERGY LETTER FOR DECEMBER



God on the Margins

I love to visit the Yorkshire coast. There is something about being on the edge of the world about the seaside - a definite, yet mysterious and ever changing margin between land and sea. I often pray as I walk along a beach - it seems somehow to lend itself to quiet reflection, I think - and I often come back to this theme of margins: how Jesus in his ministry was often to be found in rural backwaters, or among those at the margins of his society. Now, we can sometimes make the mistake of assuming that the point of Jesus seeking out those whom society was shunning was simply a matter of him curing them. Yes, Jesus heals miraculously on many occasions, but the healing itself is only part of the story. In the society in which he lived, these healings also led to people being welcomed back into the thick of things, restored in their communities and given true dignity.

So what do we learn from those on the margins of society? Well, unlikely as it sounds, they should be our role models. The diversity of what it means to be human is often most challenging for those who do not have social barriers to overcome - whether these be of race, gender, disability, sexuality or neurotypicality. The thing is, this is a direct challenge from Jesus for everyone. I bet for each of us there is someone, or some group of people we find it harder to love than others. We find it hard to love unconditionally because this is a universal human disability, and this is why we need the grace of God & the gift of the Holy Spirit to help us to love as God loves us. We need to actually see ourselves as outsiders, to get a proper perspective.

To follow Jesus is to follow God the ultimate outsider: in Jesus, God came to the extreme margins of human existence and met us there. God met us in the extremes of pain and death on the cross of Jesus. God met us in the ministry of Jesus among the excluded and marginalized. And as we prepare for Christmas, this is a helpful way to put things in perspective. God didn't rock up as a warrior, a mighty emperor with an army to rival the Romans. God turned up as a baby, born in inconvenient circumstances in an insignificant backwater of the fragile margins of an empire. At Christmas we remember how God comes out to meet us on the margins.

When we learn to love as Christ loved us, when we ignore social & cultural barriers between ourselves and others, when we truly invite God to transform us into a community of love, the result is that the love of God is born again in the world. Christmas means God is with us: God's love is loose in the world. And when that happens, there are no margins, because we haven't set a boundary: there is only an inclusive, loving community which puts all human models of society, all political structures of nationhood or community in the shade. Those, my friends and neighbours, are the glad tidings of great joy which I offer you and yours this Christmas.

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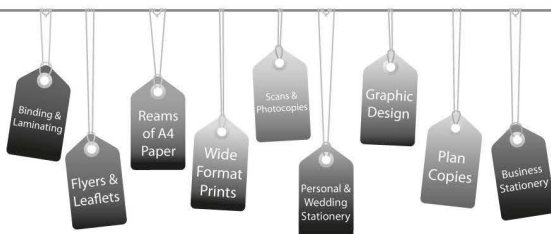

Run Bramham organisers very much appreciated visiting **Martin House** Children's Hospice to hand over funds, £1,320, raised from the Run Bramham event this year, to have a tour round the beautiful gardens, and to hear more about the brilliant work done by Martin House.

Martin House helps children and their families who are going through unimaginably difficult times. The children can be just days old, or into young adulthood. As well as providing first class medical care, the facilities there enable the children and young adults to do the sort of everyday, normal things that without help are just too difficult to accomplish.

A trip to McDonalds for example, or watching a film late at night knowing that they can lie in the next morning rather than having to fit in with a home care routine. Electronic controls for all aspects of the rooms give children some independence. The accessible garden, sensory spaces, and rooms with doors that open on to the fresh air help physically and emotionally.

Parents can have very much needed respite, sometimes just having a night's sleep knowing that others are giving their child the constant care that they need. It also provides a very precious place and time for families to spend time together in a child's last days.

Martin House supports more than 420 families every year as well as 180 bereaved families and more than 2,000 hours in the community.

It costs £9 million a year to run the hospice and only 11% of that comes from statutory funding, the rest is from fundraising by people like those who contributed to Run Bramham as volunteers or participants. It takes around 200 staff, plus volunteers, to keep Martin House going. All of this means that fundraising is absolutely vital. It is very, very special place. The Run Bramham funds seem like a drop in the ocean, but all of the drops add up, and any help you can give matters a lot.

NEW AREA DEAN

The Bishop of Selby, the Right Reverend Dr John Thomson recently commissioned our vicar, The Reverend Nick Morgan as Area Dean of New Ainsty in a service at St Mary's Church, Boston Spa. So what is a Deanery?

At the most obvious level, a Deanery is a geographical area within a Diocese. Each parish in the Church of England is part of a deanery - it is not a separate or optional body: it is part of the democratic structure of the Church of England of which each parish is a part. Just as each Parish Church Council (PCC) exercises democratic and legal rights, duties and responsibilities at the most local level, a Deanery exercises similar functions at the next level of accountability. Deaneries are grouped into Archdeaconries (areas under the care of an Archdeacon—and we are in the Archdeaconry of York) which are themselves then accountable to a Diocesan Synod. New Ainsty Deanery includes the churches of the Bramham Benefice and Clifford, north as far as the River Nidd, east of us towards York via Tadcaster (as far as Acaster Malbis, Copmanthorpe and Askham Bryan).

Parish representatives on a Deanery Synod are the means by which the deanery is held accountable (not PCCs directly) and can make strategic decisions and report back to the Diocese, and so it is important that PCCs elect and send representatives to their Deanery Synod. A Deanery is chaired by two people: the Area Dean (who is an ordained priest) and a Lay Dean (who is not ordained). Between them, these two officers of the Bishop co-chair Deanery Synod. The Area Dean also chairs meetings of the Deanery Chapter - the clergy of the deanery.

Deaneries are the forum in which consultations take place about any reorganisation in the Diocese (such as rejigging boundaries, clergy deployment, budget setting, central resourcing which churches call up from the Diocese). They are also the forum through which churches can collaborate, share resources, encourage one another, organise training and collaborative events

at a viable and more effective scale. On a practical level, a Deanery helps the senior leadership of a Diocese keep in touch with the grass roots of church life. Given the size of York Diocese (which stretches up to Middlesbrough, down to Hull and across to the Yorkshire coast) this is important, as keeping in direct contact with so many individual churches would be impractical otherwise. Often a Diocese will use Deaneries for consultation processes affecting the whole Diocese as this is a productive way of ensuring democratic accountability. Deaneries also provide a manageable forum across a geographical area which hopefully has much in common in which we can tell one another our stories, and share our concerns, hopes and vision. They provide a space in which we can learn what God is up to across a wider geographical area than our own communities, and for praying and worshipping together.

Rev'd Nick writes, "An Area Dean isn't a manager of other clergy, but it is one of those 'first among equals' roles where I'm called to represent the senior leadership team to my colleagues, and to report my colleagues' concerns back to them. Together with the Lay Dean, the Deanery Secretary and other members of the Deanery Leadership Team, I try to organise our Deanery Synod meetings such that our churches have an opportunity to listen to each other and hear one other's stories. In New Ainsty Deanery, we're here to encourage one another, support each others' ministry, and get a clearer sense of the bigger picture of what God is up to in our villages and towns. I look forward to working with my deanery colleagues at this challenging and exciting time for York Diocese, but this additional role will not take me away from my existing responsibilities as vicar,"
