Installation and Licensing of Reverend Nick Morgan as Vicar of Bramham Benefice, and the relicensing of the Reverend Trish Anslow as Associate Priest in the Bramham Benefice



The service was led by the Venerable John Day, acting Archdeacon of York, with St Mary's choir and Simon Noble on the organ. The bell-ringers of Bramham rang a wonderful peal to welcome us all. The service was a celebration of ministry at which Rev'd Nick Morgan changed his job title from Priest in Charge to vicar, Rev'd Trish Anslow was relicensed to the Benefice for a further two years, and Nick Lane Fox was formally welcomed as joint patron of the Benefice.

Rev'd Nick's job does not actually change. This was simply a legal matter, related to the building of the new vicarage in Boston Spa which meant that the living had to be suspended. When this happens, the priest charged with overseeing ministry and worship is not known as a vicar or rector, but is simply placed in charge, and is therefore known as a Priest in Charge instead. Now that the new vicarage is built, the living is no longer suspended, Nick becomes vicar, and the patrons are once again fully involved, legally speaking.

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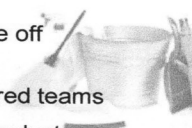
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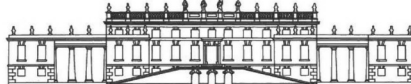

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**Welcome to the April update from
your Parish Council**

By the time this is being read the Easter celebrations and its holidays will be over and the next big series of events on the horizon will be the 4 days (June 2nd, 3rd, 4th and 5th) celebrating the Queen's Platinum Jubilee.

Parish Councillor Vacancy: There is a vacancy on the Parish Council which can now be filled by co-option, if you are interested, please contact the Clerk at clerk@bramhamparishcouncil.gov.uk for information about the eligibility criteria and person specification. Deadline for application is 5pm Friday 29th April 2022 and they will be considered at the Parish Council meeting on 4th May 2022.

Crime Report: Bramham has recorded no crimes this month (March). The police are advising all residents to remain vigilant and to report anything which is untoward if they think a crime has been committed, this can be done by ringing 101 if this is not an emergency.

Bramham Archive: I am pleased to report that the documentation will now be transferred to the West Yorkshire Archive Service (WYAS) which will further catalogue and safely store the material; the documents will remain the property of the Parish Council and access to the documents will be by appointment with WYAS. Annual Parish Meeting (APM): The APM will be held at 10.00am on the 28th of May in the Village Hall and all residents are invited to attend. All village groups will be invited to give (if they so wish) a short presentation of their activities throughout the year (2021/2022) and the Council, through the Senior Citizen's Working Group will discuss the future of the Senior Citizen's Centre.

Asset Development Working Group (ADWG): Council accepted that no further major capital expenditure projects should be considered/undertaken until such time as the development involving the Senior Citizen's centre had been concluded.

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Parish Council Annual Newsletter/Report: All village Groups/ Clubs will be contacted and asked if they wish to contribute an update of their activities over the year 2021/2022 to the Newsletter/Report which when compiled will be published on the website. Groups/Clubs may wish to reinforce their efforts made over the year by showcasing their contributions at the APM (see above).

Pavilion and Playing Field: It has been agreed the cost of hiring of the pavilion and/or playing field will be increased by 20% forthwith but the fees for bookings already made will be honoured. Details will be posted on the website.

There has been agreement in principle for more picnic tables to be arranged around the playing field and playground area and further details will follow once the Assets & Amenities Committee and Council have agreed budget details. Also, Council has agreed that a further defibrillator will be purchased and mounted on the outside wall of the Pavilion.

Queen's Platinum Jubilee: Arrangements are ongoing for an afternoon tea/garden party to take place at the pavilion and on the playing field on Sunday, 5th June. Thanks to the Community Fund we will also have a marquee available which will enhance the facilities available especially should the weather not be ideal. The drinks (bar/tea/coffee/etc) will be at 2022 prices but the sandwiches and cakes will be priced as near to 1953 prices as possible. Several village groups are arranging activities on the field to help make this event a truly memorable occasion.

Traffic Management The Mobile Speed Indicator Device (SID) will again be appearing at various locations, which this month will include Aberford Road and Lyndon Road. Our sincere thanks to the three volunteers from last year who have once again offered their services in 2022.

Wildlife Area: Councillors will be speaking with Bramham Park Estates before the final decision is made at the May Council meeting regarding the future of the Wildlife Area. At the present time the Wildlife area is **CLOSED** and off limits. Finally, I would like to thank all the volunteers who tidied up the Senior Citizen Centre's garden on Saturday the 9th April.

Next Meeting: The next meeting will take place at 7.00pm in Bramham Pavilion on Wednesday 4th May 2022.

Leeds Festival Residents' tickets Scheme

There has recently been some discussion, particularly on Social Media, regarding the pricing of residents' tickets for the Leeds Festival.

The ticket price this year is £65. This price is determined by the promoter, Festival Republic and applies to Bramham and other villages involved in the scheme. Such a ticket gives access to the Festival throughout its duration. In addition, it provides the use of a shuttle bus to and from the site and access to Guest Area facilities. This gives a Bramham resident a minimum 75% discount against the amount paid by the general public.

The money collected goes into the Bramham Community Fund for projects for the benefit of the village. Since the scheme's inception in 2003, the fund has supported a diverse number of projects and community groups across the village. Perhaps more significantly, the discounts enjoyed by Bramham residents over the same period approaches £3 million.

These tickets are generously given to the village at the discretion of Festival Republic. There is no right to them, and Festival Republic could just withdraw the scheme at any time, thus depriving residents of both the discounts and the grants from the Community Fund. Perhaps these factors should be taken into consideration when criticising the ticket prices.

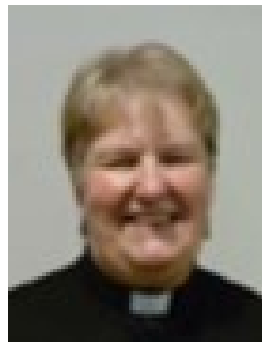

THE CLERGY LETTER FOR MAY



Are you ever at a loss for words?

Maybe you are out for a day of sightseeing and the sheer beauty of what you come across renders you speechless. There are plenty of places in our glorious county that can do that to you. The skill of certain artists can make you tongue-tied when you look at their work and a visit to a cathedral or other major buildings just force silence on you as you take in their grandeur.

All of these examples I am sure you have experienced at times in your life, beauty of all sorts can still the voice so that your other senses can appreciate what is before you.

The other side of the coin can also rob you of words; the senseless acts of violence or vandalism we see around us sometimes; the acts of war that fill our news media at the moment. These things reduce us to a stunned sort of silence. We chatter words at our families and friends, but there is nothing constructive we can say to improve the situations.

I wonder if the disciples felt stunned into silence after the events of Easter, all those years ago. They had gone through such a turmoil of emotions through those days and wondered what was to become of them in the future. They had been tutored by Jesus throughout his ministry, but the Good News he had talked of had only just been seen in all its glory on Easter morning.

On that day, there was anything but silence! There was such excitement amongst them all as they each recounted their sighting of Jesus. Of course Thomas had to add his words of doubt until he, too had seen Jesus. His words summed up all their feelings in those stunning words 'My Lord and my God'.

After that there was a silence for a time. The disciples were quiet in public . They kept themselves hidden and silent in case they were arrested. Within the next few days, they had all seen Jesus and I am sure that words were leaked out to friends and families telling of the excitement of encounters with the risen Christ.

The promises that came with the meetings were all about words. The disciples were promised words that would be given to them in their ministries. Words that would tell others of Jesus and his Good News. Those fishermen, tentmakers, taxmen and others were given the words to tell of Jesus to anyone who would listen.

That same promise is ours today! We don't have to make great speeches from a platform to a room full of people to talk of Jesus in our lives. We don't have to travel the world on missionary journeys. We will be given just the right words to tell our neighbours and friends what it is like to have Jesus in our lives.

In these weeks when the joy of Easter is still fresh in our minds we have to remember that we are disciples and have been given the same directive to go and spread the word. The glory of Easter is like everything we are about as Christians, so tell all those others who are missing out . You *will* be given the right words; it only takes you to open your mouth and tell the story, you will never be lost for words!

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BRAMHAM VILLAGE HALL A COMMUNITY MEETING PLACE

Bramham Village Hall Committee is planning to facilitate a drop-in, community meeting place and cafe primarily for the over 60s but also open to their friends, families, and carers. The idea is to provide a regular, not-for-profit, community facility in the heart of Bramham run by villagers for villager

We are asking for volunteers to establish and help run the facility for just a few hours each week. Volunteers will work as a team to set up and support the facility. There will be opportunities to assist in the kitchen and in setting tables, preparing and serving teas, coffees, soup, sandwiches, cake etc., clearing tables and generally tidying up. It may also be possible to arrange for “soup with a smile” deliveries to the elderly, disabled and isolated in our community who may not be able to drop-in themselves.

The aim is to create a welcoming environment for people to chat and relax over a cup of tea or a bowl of soup, as well as for those who volunteer their services.

The café will be in the Village Hall, which is owned by the people of Bramham, so hopefully a wide spectrum of people from the village will be interested in getting involved. An initial meeting of volunteers will be arranged to kick start the initiative, if there is sufficient interest

Lottery funding to help Wetherby charity dementia café reopen

A popular support café in Wetherby for people living with dementia and their carers can reopen, thanks to National Lottery funding.

Wetherby in Support of the Elderly (WiSE) says it plans to reopen its 'Meet Up Monday Memory Café' this summer as a result of the £4,608 National Lottery Awards For All grant.

The cash will pay for a year's venue hire costs for the café, which provides tailored activities for those living with dementia and weekly respite and support for their carers.

WiSE Corporate Fundraiser Liz Robinson, said: "We're proud of the way we've restored our core services in the wake of multiple pandemic lockdowns, but our once popular memory café was the last remaining event we'd been unable to reopen after its initial funding ended.

"We're really grateful to National Lottery Awards For All for this funding, which will pay for a safe, well managed venue in which to host the café, helping to create a much needed support hub for people in our communities living with dementia and their carers."

The weekly Meet Up Monday Memory Café was originally set up several years ago to respond to the growing number of dementia cases in Wetherby and its surrounding villages.

The café supported those living with dementia and their carers by providing an appropriate setting to focus on clients' wellbeing, with sessions facilitated by two professional members of Over the Rainbow Care, alongside WiSE's own trained volunteers. Support and advice was also offered to family carers to assist them in their day-to-day continuing and challenging caring role.

Further fundraising is underway to pay for paid, professional support workers ahead of the café's reopening.

Wetherby in Support of the Elderly (WiSE) is a small registered charity set up in 2003 in Wetherby, West Yorkshire which aims to improve the quality of life for the over 60s by providing community based activities, information, help, advice and support.

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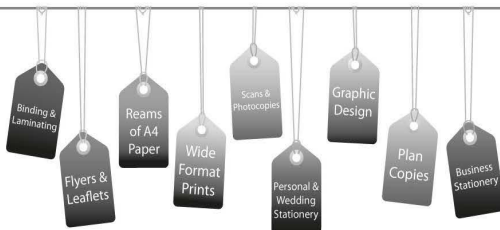

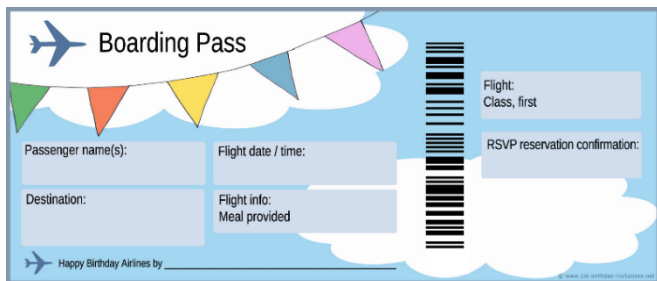

The scheme provides a low cost door-to-door pick up and drop off service for people who are less mobile, don't drive, or struggle with public transport .



We have a number of trusted volunteer drivers who will collect a service user and drive them to GP and local healthcare appointments, WiSE activities, or to meet up with friends.

Journeys are offered Monday to Friday from 8am to 6pm. The service costs £2 per journey, plus 45 pence for every mile travelled, which is paid for at the destination. Drivers are able to accommodate fold-up rollators or walking sticks, but unfortunately cannot accommodate wheelchairs.
