“THE VILLAGE HUB”

A New Pop-In Cafe and Community Meeting Place

in Bramham Village Hall

Bramham Village Hall Committee is facilitating a drop-in, community meeting place and cafe. Its doors will be open to everyone; the over 60's, their friends, families, and carers will be especially welcome. The idea is to provide a regular, not-for-profit, community facility in the heart of Bramham run by villagers for villagers. The café will be in the Village Hall, which is owned by the people of Bramham, and be run by a team of around 20 volunteers from across the village. It will be open at least once a week and hopefully provide a welcoming, safe, warm and dementia-friendly environment for people to get together with old friends, catch up on village gossip, meet new friends or just hang out. The team of volunteers met together in the Village Hall on 9 May and have signed up as a group to giving just a few hours of their time each week (or whenever they can) to setting up, supporting and helping to run the facility. The aim is to create a welcoming environment for visitors and volunteers alike. People can chat and relax over a cup of tea and maybe a snack, or just pop in to browse the newspapers or a magazine over a coffee and cake. There will be opportunities for volunteers to assist in the kitchen and in setting tables, preparing and serving teas, coffees, cake etc., clearing tables and generally tidying up. The team are also hoping to arrange for “soup with a smile” deliveries to reach out to the elderly, disabled and isolated in our community who may not be able to drop-in themselves. Other community groups will be invited to showcase their own activities and run information sessions or workshops. We would love to hear from anyone who is interested in coming along about the kind of activities and topics they would enjoy. The “Village Hub” will be launched later in the summer, so, in the meantime, do tell your friends, neighbours and family about it and watch this space for more information. 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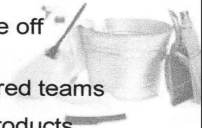
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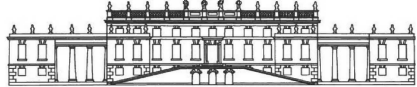

**Welcome to the May update from
your Parish Council**

By the time this arrives the next big series of events on the horizon will be the 4 days (June 2nd, 3rd, 4th and 5th) celebrating the Queen's Platinum Jubilee.

Parish Councillor Vacancy: There is a vacancy for a Councillor on the Parish Council and if you are interested, please contact the Clerk (Nancy Fairbairn) at clerk@bramhamparishcouncil.gov.uk for information about the eligibility criteria and person specification.

PACT Report (Meeting held 03/05/2022 at Wetherby Methodist hall):

Representatives from Wetherby and surrounding villages met to discuss the issues relevant to residents and for the police to share the latest crime figures. With the relaxation of the Covid regulations and greater social mixing certain crimes have increased. However in general the level of crime remains pleasingly low.

The issue common to all the villages was that of speeding. Mention was made of those parishes who have proactively addressed the issue e.g. Bramham and Clifford PCs by jointly purchasing a mobile SID have with the help of volunteers collected a substantial volume of data. This has now been offered to Thorp Arch to support their campaign for further speed monitoring.

The other main issue is that of antisocial behaviour, particularly by young people and especially in the playground areas. Boston Spa has suffered considerably because of the Grafitti issue which has been reported and dealt with, but which is obviously distressing for all concerned. Wetherby has the issue of Sandringham Park where similar damage occurs. PCSO Lou Crossland and Sergeant Jim Allen were on hand to answer queries and propose potential solutions.

The two electric bikes purchased by the Ward Councillors to help PCSO officers in their coverage of Wetherby will be returned from assisting in Roundhay park.

The Pact meeting is every month on the first Tuesday, and residents are very much encouraged to attend and contribute.

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The APM will be held at 10.00am on the 28th of May in the Village Hall and all residents are invited to attend. All village groups will be invited to give (if they so wish) a short presentation of their activities throughout the year (2021/2022) and the Council, through the Senior Citizen's Working Group will discuss the future of the Senior Citizen's Centre. Copies of the PC Annual Newsletter will be available on the day.

Pavilion and Playing Field:

At the time of writing the disruption cause by the incursion onto the playing field has for the moment been resolved and I would like to thank Nancy, for her prompt action, Dan for initially recognising the problems and alerting Nancy and the relevant agencies and all Councillors for their speedy response in helping to clean-up, which is so often required after these events.

It has been agreed to purchase more picnic tables to be arranged around the playing field and playground area and further details will follow.

Queen's Platinum Jubilee:

Arrangements are ongoing for an afternoon tea/garden party to take place at the pavilion and on the playing field on Sunday, 5th June. The drinks (bar/tea/coffee/etc) will be at 2022 prices but the sandwiches and cakes will be priced as near to 1953 prices as possible. Several village groups are arranging activities on the field to help make this event a truly memorable occasion.

Traffic Management:

The data collected from the static and mobile SIDs has been posted on the website. Whilst the evidence from the static SID and the mobile SID (when sited on Clifford Road) is similar to that collected in previous months the data collected on Lyndon and Aberford Roads has pleasingly shown that 85% of motorists are driving at or below the speed limit. I would urge everyone to be vigilant because there are still those drivers who believe the limits do not apply to them!

Wildlife Area: is now permanently closed to residents and there is NO ACCESS across the weed screen.

Next Meeting: will take place at 7.00pm in Bramham Pavilion on Wednesday 1st June 2022.

The Clergy Letter for June

Quiet, steadfast faith is a precious thing. It's the kind of faith which bears fruit over a long period, is rooted in prayer, and has the cross of Jesus as its compass point. One amazing example of this is Her Majesty, Queen Elizabeth. Yes, she is Supreme Governor of the Church of England and on occasion wears far more bling than even the most overdressed member of the clergy, but hers is not an ostentatious faith. Even before she was crowned, in her first Christmas broadcast in 1952, she said, 'Pray for me ... that God may give me wisdom and strength to carry out the solemn promises I shall be making, and that I may faithfully serve Him and you, all the days of my life.' Her Christmas broadcasts to the Commonwealth are among the few speeches she writes herself, and frequently they refer to Jesus. In her Christmas broadcast in December 2000, she said, 'For me the teachings of Christ and my own personal accountability before God provide a framework in which I try to lead my life.' Clearly faith is something our Queen knows as something to be lived, not simply something to be believed. Quiet, steadfast faith means putting one step in front of the other, no matter how expensively that foot is shod. In 2008 the Queen said, 'I hope that, like me, you will be comforted by the example of Jesus of Nazareth who, often in circumstances of great adversity, managed to live an outgoing, unselfish and sacrificial life ... He makes it clear that genuine human happiness and satisfaction lie more in giving than receiving; more in serving than in being served.'

As we celebrate her Platinum Jubilee this month, I give thanks for the quiet, steadfast faith of our monarch. I also give thanks for all Christians in Parliament, drawn from many political parties, who regularly unite in prayer together and seek the common good, attempting to put their own faith into practice in their decision-making and policy-shaping.

They will not always agree with one another politically, but like the Church as a whole, being able to pray and enjoy fellowship with those with whom we disagree is a sign of the unity of Spirit which Jesus prayed the Church would receive. Indeed, the Church of England continually prays for all in positions of authority and especially Elizabeth our Queen.

Let's pray that her faith would inspire ours, so that whatever power we possess - whether economic, in the use of our talents, time and gifts, our resources, our influence - we might use that power in the service of one another, serving the common good.

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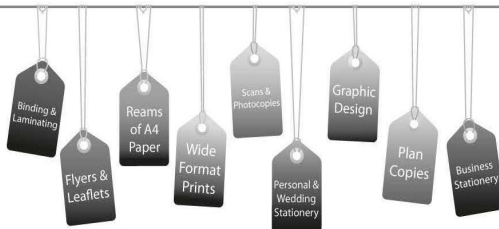

The Thread of God's Love

In 563 an Irish monk was forced to leave his homeland because of a conflict that had led to a misuse of power and even bloodshed. On Pentecost Sunday he arrived on the island of Iona off the north-west coast of Scotland with twelve companions. There he began a new way of life, founded on Christ's mercy and forgiveness of the past, and so created one of the great centres of faith and mission in the Christian Church. His name was Columba, and we keep his feast day on 9th June.

His monastery on Iona started as a small cluster of wooden buildings with a church and a guesthouse. Around were fields of crops and cattle and bees. But under Columba's guidance, it grew, and from Iona monks were sent into Scotland as one arm of a missionary advance that reached down through England to France and across Europe.

That outreach was an amazing achievement. But just as amazing was the consolidation of monastic life on Iona that resulted two centuries later in the Book of Kells. This text of the four Gospels was begun by scribes and artists in the library of Iona. It grew into one of the masterpieces of Celtic art that was taken to Kells in Ireland to escape the Viking invaders who ravaged the island.

Along with the text of the Gospels, there are illustrations of Jesus, Mary and the four evangelists, together with decorations at once intricate and fantastic: patterns that interweave and interlace across the page with an odd face here and a weird creature there. The design is in brilliant detail, and you can follow the lines as they weave in and out. This delight in patterns is evident in lots of Celtic art.

It is good to imagine Columba on Iona meditating on the thread of God's grace woven into his life as he looked back to his years in Ireland and his pilgrimage to Iona. It might have seemed at one glance a complicated interweaving of events and experiences, and then perhaps as he looked again, he would see God's love threading its way through that history and redeeming both it and him.

It is the same for us. As we look at our lives, they may seem complex and involved patterns of events and circumstances taking us here and there. As we ponder those patterns, then we can begin to see a thread woven into the patterns that guides and leads us on. And as we stand back, all the patterns and threads seem to make sense as we spot that guiding thread. Just as we can stand back from the designs of this page and see God's love spelling out the name of Christ, our Lord.

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Wetherby charity celebrates helping thousands of older people in stellar year in which it had almost 12,000 interactions with older people across the district.

Wetherby in Support of the Elderly (WiSE) has worked hard to restore key services as the Covid-19 risk has reduced, including much needed social support for those more isolated.

At least 5,370 people visited the popular WiSE Owl Café, whilst hundreds more attended the charity's packed activities programme- from chairgym to knitting.

Sixty people had their grass cut each month, 153 people were contacted by a friendly caller or visitor and the charity's advice service received 687 contacts. A further 312 transport journeys were made- whereby volunteers drive older people to activities or social engagements they would otherwise have missed.

Mark Dobson, Chief Operating Officer at WiSE, said: "For the charity, the last 12 months has been a year of two halves. The first half saw us continuing to work as a Covid-19 hub for North East Leeds. We also assisted with the vaccination rollout, made wellbeing calls, and conducted telephone befriending sessions. "The second half of the year saw us restarting our key services in a safe and controlled way, starting with the WiSE Owl Café at Boston Spa Village Hall.

To have had close to 12,000 contacts with older people in our communities is down to the incredible work of our much loved army of volunteers and small but dedicated team of paid staff."

In the last year, WiSE has also funded a cookery course for kitchen shy older men, a Christmas Day lunch at Bramham Village Hall and launched its 'Send a Smile' postal scheme.

A recent consultation asked local people for their views on its work, after it expanded the range of services offered during the pandemic lockdowns. It was recently presented with a special recognition award by the Leeds City Council and Voluntary Action Leeds in recognition of its efforts during the pandemic.

Wetherby in Support of the Elderly (WiSE) is a registered charity organisation part funded by Leeds City Council (LCC). Its aim is to improve quality of life for the over 60s by providing community based activities, information, help and support. For more information, or to donate, visit www.w-ise.org.uk
