Christ's Ambassador Sermon given on 10th September 2022 at an ecumenical Special Commemoration Service for our Sovereign Lady, the Late Queen Elizabeth II. St Mary the Virgin, Boston Spa.

Bible Reading: Revelation 21.1-7

What an amazing vision from St John the Divine: "And I saw a new heaven and a new earth.... the holy city (a vision of peace) coming down from heaven to be among humanity... see, God is making all things new"

This vision of God's Kingdom at the end of time is a reality into which our late Sovereign, Queen Elizabeth, has a clearer glimpse than we. By the grace of Jesus her Lord and Saviour, she is welcomed among the saints in heaven, the limitations of age, time and mortality lifted.

But God's Kingdom is not merely a distant vision. In Jesus, the Kingdom of God was inaugurated and made a reality on earth as it is in heaven – it is the now and future Kingdom. The home of God is among mortals, God will dwell with them, and they will be God's people: that is our vision for the here and now, as well as for eternity. This means that our lives are not mere preludes to the hereafter, but they matter: they are part and parcel of God's business here on earth. In our earthly lives, we are called to be citizens of heaven, not exiles – but ambassadors. Queen Elizabeth certainly embraced that calling in her unique calling as monarch, supreme governor of the Church of England, head of the commonwealth and the myriad other roles she undertook. She was an amazing ambassador of the Kingdom of God.

Many people have reacted more strongly, more emotionally, than they thought they would to the death of our Queen. There is a sense of the end of an era, not merely because the crown passes to a new King, but because Her Majesty's life was so bound up with our personal, as well as national, history. Few of us can remember a time when she was not there as part of our life, often in the background rather than the foreground on a day-to-day basis, but always there. Her speech to the nation during the Covid lockdown was such a comfort to so many

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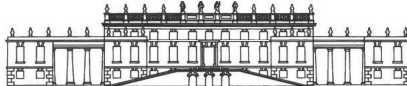


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head of our national family, talking to us to strengthen our resolve, offer comfort to the bereaved and fearful, and assure us of better times ahead. For some, even though she was old and frail, her death was a huge shock as she was the nation's rock – always there, especially in times of uncertainty. But death is a universal reality, and one which our queen did not fear because, like her son King Charles, she had a strong, personal faith in Jesus and was assured of her salvation. But this personal faith was not something she kept to herself. She attended worship faithfully, and often publicly; she was constant in daily prayer; and she brought her faith to bear on her role. Her annual Christmas speech often drew on this faith, and her very natural way of expressing this and linking it to our national life, and the life of the Commonwealth, stemmed from her faith being a lived reality. She lived in the now and future Kingdom of heaven, lived out that reality of God being at home here and now in the world we live in through the person of Jesus, and through the presence of God's Church enlivened by the Holy Spirit right here, right now, across the world.

We are rightly saddened by Queen Elizabeth's death. Death is no matter to be brushed off or belittled. Indeed, death is such a serious matter that God sent his only Son, Jesus Christ, to take death upon himself and defeat it on the cross. That resurrection faith was Her Majesty's faith, and so in the light of the resurrection of Jesus on Easter day, we can rejoice amid our sadness that she has a clearer vision of that eternal new heaven and new earth which St John the Divine wrote about.

We thank God for calling Queen Elizabeth to her role on earth, for sustaining her in that role, and for empowering her to be such a wonderful ambassador for God's Kingdom. More than that, we thank Jesus for his presence in her life and work, and for the example that gives: how a life of faith can make a difference. That example has certainly given comfort and strength to King Charles as he begins this new chapter of his own calling as a servant of God, and I am glad that he, too, is a prayerful person of strong faith.

Today we say "Thank God for Elizabeth, the servant queen, ambassador of Christ." And as we look ahead to an unknown future, we remember that God alone is Sovereign, Jesus alone is Head of the Church, but we pray that King Charles III might like his mother, be a true ambassador for God's Kingdom and, not only for the Church of England, but for all followers of Christ in our nation and Commonwealth, our partner in the Gospel. God save the King. Amen.

What is in a Name?

The Senior Citizens' Centre, as it is currently known and which is now in the process of being demolished and rebuilt, is a community asset which was generously gifted to the Parish under Covenant by the Lane Fox family in 1968 and thereafter administered by the Parish Council. There is a date stone reading 1959; the building was opened in 1960 and then subsequently extended in size in the 1980s. Initially the Centre was known as the "Old People's Shelter" and reflected the personal covenant in the Conveyance dated 20th September 1968: "The Council hereby covenants with the vendors that it will use the property hereby conveyed for the benefit of the aged of the Parish of Bramham". Subsequently, with the Lane Fox Family approval and with due deference to social attitudes of the time, the name was changed to the "Senior Citizen's Centre" it being considered inappropriate to use the ageist term "Old".

The Centre is now entering a new and exciting phase and having consulted with Nick Lane Fox regarding the covenant wording he has acknowledged and agreed that the Centre should be available to residents of Bramham Parish of all age groups.

The current Working group which is overseeing the demolition and rebuild and which is charged by Bramham parish Council to see the project through to completion is proposing that the name should again be changed to reflect the future use of the building by all age groups and the name itself should not be prescriptive for any one specific group.

The Working Group is proposing to Council that when rebuilt the building should be known as the **Bramham Parish Centre**. The reasoning behind the name is as follows: Firstly, the building is obviously within "Bramham" on the Square, hence "Bramham"; secondly, it will be available to all "Parish" residents (and coincidentally will be administered by the Parish Council), hence "Parish"; and thirdly, it is in the "Centre" of the village and also will be a "Centre" where activities can be held by all Parish Residents. The Working group believe that "**Bramham Parish Centre**" is a logical and descriptive name for the building encompassing its position, its future use and those that will be using the facility.

Any comments should be submitted to the Clerk, clerk@bramhamparishcouncil.gov.uk by 27th October 2022 at the latest; Council will be making the decision on the name change at the November meeting.

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PACT:

There has been a general increase in antisocial behaviour focussed on a number of areas within the Outer Northeast Region; fortunately, Bramham appears not to have been affected as much as the other areas.

The Pact meeting is held every month on the first Tuesday in the Methodist Hall in Wetherby, and residents are very much encouraged to attend and contribute. The next PACT meeting will be on Tuesday 4th October.

Senior Citizen's Centre:

I am pleased to report that the demolition phase of the project started on the 5th September and is being closely monitored. The contractor APT Construction has undertaken to ensure that there is minimal disruption to surrounding properties due to dust, noise and inevitably a slight increase in parking.

The Working Group is suggesting a change of name to the "Bramham Parish Centre". Any comments should be submitted to the Clerk, clerk@bramhamparishcouncil.gov.uk by 27th October 2022 at the latest; Council will be making the decision on the name change at the November meeting

Pavilion and Playing Field:

The new temporary goal posts have been erected and are being regularly used on an impromptu basis. For Health and safety, they have been anchored in place, which should avoid both personal injury and damage to the posts themselves. **Please do not move them** – they will be moved around by Councillors to protect the grass when necessary.

Council agreed at it's meeting on the 7th September to approve the use of large limestone rocks to protect the Freely Lane boundary and deter further incursions onto the field. My thanks to Cllr Prest for arranging the stones and transport within days of the Council meeting. At present the main gateway to the car park is protected by a chicane of logs and Council further approved the placement of a height barrier once all permissions have been received.

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Collingham FC have withdrawn their Saturday side and so will no longer be seen on the field on a Saturday morning however Clifford FC Juniors have taken their place and will play on the Saturday mornings instead.

A major gas leak was reported by a resident involving the gas meter in the corner of the field which necessitated an emergency call-out to the NGN, who immediately disconnected the supply. This has now been repaired and the stability of the gas meter and housing improved. My thanks to JP for his late night intervention and calling out NGN.

Bramham Show:

Sadly, the show was cancelled this year due to the unforeseen events of foremost importance to our nation and beyond and the Council joins the rest of the country mourning the loss of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II. To have to cancel at such a late stage in everyone's preparations was of course very disappointing but Councillors felt that it was the correct decision under the circumstances. There will be a Produce Show next year.

Next Meeting:

The next meeting will take place at 7.00pm in Bramham Pavilion on Wednesday 5th October 2022.

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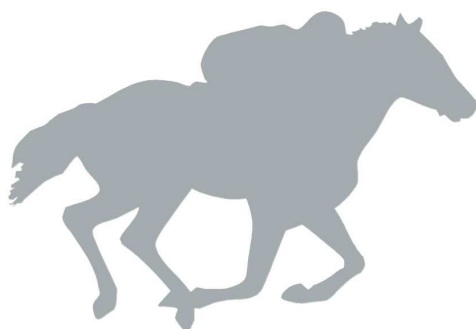


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Guide me, O thou great redeemer

One of my favourite hymns is Guide me, O thou great redeemer, partly because its tune (Cwm Rhondda) is great fun to sing, but also because of its sentiment. It's a prayer, asking God to guide me through life and to give me what I need to get through things. It's hard to be sure we're getting things right as we go through life, and indeed there is an array of people offering to help guide us. Whether we think of our career, our mental health, our physical wellbeing, our relationships or indeed any aspect of life, there are life coaches, personal trainers, mentors, relationship counsellors and so on.

For Christians, Faith itself offers a framework to underpin all of the above. It's not simply a matter of looking at decisions, relationships, outcomes, processes and thinking "What would Jesus do?". It's more that, it's about putting God at the heart of what we do.

We do this in several ways. When we begin each day, we can start by offering the day to God in prayer. For some, this can be through joining a service of Morning Prayer – indeed, I do this daily, and on most weekdays livestream it on the church Facebook page so others can join in with me. But for most people, it can be saying The Lord's Prayer, or finding a way to offer the day to God in simple terms.

The act of offering the day and its tasks to God reminds us that there is something bigger than ourselves: we are part of a community, an interactive part of God's world, and our words and deeds contribute to whether the day will be one which glorifies God or not. It's not all about us, but it does remind us to look outside ourselves and commit to loving our neighbours and serving God. Praising God as part of our daily prayers also helps us look beyond the mundane and our own worries, and then offering our worries and concerns to God – both our own, and those of others – is a positive way to set a course for the day, asking God to guide us.

At the end of the day, it's good to look back and reflect. There is a spiritual practice I use called the Examen. This involves finding a quiet place, taking a few deep, slow breaths, actively remembering God's presence with you and committing a short time to God. You then remember the day starting from when you woke up: perhaps naming the events of the day in a list, and as you do this ask yourself some questions. What can I give thanks for today? Where was God in the day? Where did I recognize this as it happened, and where was God perhaps at work under the surface, recognized only when I look back? Where did God feel blocked or far away from me today? It can also be useful to reflect on my moods through the day, the positive and negative energy around the day, and who can I pray for who I encountered today? At the end, I simply say some words from Psalm 31, "Into you hands I commend my spirit, for you have redeemed me, O Lord, O God of truth." Topping and tailing the day with God means that, wherever the day has taken me, I am aware of God's guiding hand – or its absence, perhaps, and am better equipped, over time, to be aware of life's course, and where the pilgrim journey of my faith has been taking me.

TRY PRAYING

An initiative from Churches in the lower Wharfe and The Tadcaster Methodist Circuit in October 2022

Prayer 'Do not be anxious about anything, but in every situation, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God.' (Philippians 4 v 6 - NIV)

For those of us who go to Church, prayer is a natural part of our lives. Formal prayers, communal prayers, prayers over the dying and prayers of blessing at wedding or christening. Prayers when we're sad or lonely, prayers of thanks when things go right.

But, what about the 90% of people who don't go to Church? You might be surprised to learn, research has shown that:

- 27 million people in the UK pray
- • half of those who pray believe God hears their prayers
- • of people who say they are not religious, 1 in 5 pray
- Everyone has times in their lives when they have a need for prayer. The morning of a job interview; when a loved one is sick; the 5 minutes before an exam. Most people have prayed in moments of desperation. Was someone listening? Was the prayer answered? 'Try praying' is a way for all of our Churches to reach out to those looking for answers. In a very gentle way it gives others the opportunity to be in relationship with the God who loves them and wants only the best for them. And we need your help to make this happen. If the thought of that fills you with fear - read again Paul's words at the start of this article!

So - what's going on? Over the next few weeks, from Bardsey to Appleton Roebuck, you'll start to see banners like the one on the front page - and so will the people who live around us but who don't go to Church. There will be coverage on social media and newspapers and radio stations. People will wonder what's going on!

At some point during October, your Church will provide you with a booklet - small enough to fit in a pocket or a handbag, but packed with ideas about prayer. Please read it, ask questions about it, become comfortable with it - but don't keep it! The plan is to pass it on - to family, friend, colleague, carer, maybe even a stranger - anyone who you think might benefit.

And that's it! That is all that we're asking you to do. We hope that you might choose to pray for the individual you've chosen. We hope that you might choose to pray for opportunities to pass on more booklets - that is entirely up to you. But can you imagine the effect of hundreds of us, from a variety of Churches, working together to spread the good news - what a great message of unity and hope!

Schools are joining in A number of Primary Schools in the area will be spending time during October learning about prayer. Potentially, that's hundreds of children (and their teachers) discovering something so important for the rest of their lives but also sharing with parents. We already have success stories to share and hope there will be many more!



Although we are now in summer and most of us don't have to heat our homes, many of us



have become more aware of other things that we use energy for, whether that is to cook our food, power the vacuum cleaner, boil the kettle or heat the water for a bath or shower. It all uses energy.

The autumn price hike will arrive just when the weather starts to turn colder and we will all be wanting to switch our heating back on. So with this backdrop the Boston Spa, Wetherby and Villages Community Green Group held an event, by running a free Big Energy Meeting in July in Boston Spa Methodist Hall. The event was well attended by residents from across the Boston Spa and Wetherby area. They heard from a number of speakers, who presented information on both quick easy things we can do to save energy, to larger investment ideas that will give us bigger savings but over a longer period of time. There was also a local resident speaking who has recently had his house retro-fitted to save energy. This was followed by an open forum, with questions to the speakers and sharing of experiences in this area.

The Boston Spa, Wetherby and Villages Community Green Group is now working with Wetherby Town Council Climate Emergency Committee to organise a much larger event on Saturday 24th September 10am-3pm at Wetherby Town Hall. There will be a number of speakers, from local residents with tips on saving energy, to local businesses talking about retrofitting insulation, installing low carbon solar and heat pumps, to Better Homes Leeds, talking about funding. This will be followed by an open forum for discussion and questions.

It will be a family friendly event with children's activities, tombola and delicious refreshments available to enjoy.
Do put the date in your diaries now.

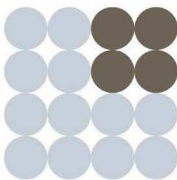

The Bramham Archive would be pleased to collect your memories. Many families purchased their first television set especially for the 2nd June 1953 to watch this historic event.

What did your family do?

Perhaps invite all the neighbours around to watch your brand new TV—but on a very small screen (Perhaps 26 x 26 cm)—in a very large brown box, which televised the events, in black and white of course.

Schoolchildren in Leeds were presented with half pint glass tankards with the Royal Coat of Arms and the date upon it and the finishing touch of a gold rim around the top! Tea towels galore, colour picture books and the souvenir industry had a field day.

Coronation chicken became a staple for every village Hall event for years afterwards.

The actual day the weather was terrible it rained continually. In the evening the plan was to light beacons all around the country. Sadly the weather was so appalling only the “real troopers” went up to light or try to light the sodden bonfires, a real shame.

In cinemas for weeks afterwards you were able to see “John and Julie at the Coronation”. We would love to have your special memories of the day.

Equally if you went to London or Edinburgh for the Laying in State for H M Queen Elizabeth II it would be interesting to have your memory of this extraordinary week. Future generations of Bramhamers will be interested to read them.
