Bramham Village Hall is opening its doors to bring people in our community together in a new, not-for-profit, pop-in Community Café run entirely by volunteers from the village. It's about providing somewhere for people to meet, not about making money!

The “Village Hub” will be open every Monday from 11.30am to 2pm. To celebrate the grand opening of the café we will be offering free tea, coffee and biscuits on launch day. The idea is to provide a friendly meeting place where residents of all ages can enjoy tea, coffee, a bowl of soup, soft drinks and home-made cakes, read newspapers and magazines, play cards & games, do jigsaws, swap books, swap stories and more in a warm, welcoming, safe, supportive and familiar space.

UPDATE FOR December

As a reminder Council resolved last month to amend “Standing Orders” such that the Council meetings will now be held on the second Wednesday of each month **NOT** the first as has been the case in the past. As in previous years there will not usually be a meeting of Council in August.

PACT: The level of antisocial behaviour around the Ward stays very similar to previous months and fortunately Bramham remains relatively untouched; the colder weather seems to have brought about a small reduction in the overall figures. There have been a number of burglaries in the overall area and both houses and garages or sheds have been targeted, but again Bramham has been largely spared.

The Pact meeting is held every month on the first Tuesday in the Methodist Hall in Wetherby, and residents are very much encouraged to attend and contribute. The next PACT meeting will be on Tuesday 3rd January 2023.

Traffic Management: *Data from the repaired “fixed” (Clifford Road) SID is available on the Parish Council website and is very similar to previous monthly records.*

The Shop/Post Office: The Parish Council is continuing to consult with the Post Office Retail Team to secure a positive outcome and a continuation of service should the current Post office/Shop close once Lynn’s tenure expires. To date the Council has not received any confirmation that the Shop/Post Office will close when Lynn leaves.

The Parish Council considered the option of applying for the Post Office/Shop building to be registered as an Asset of Community Value (ACV). If a property that is registered as an ACV is put up for sale the nominating body can enact the Community Right to Bid. This places a moratorium period of six months on the sale to allow time for the nominating body to determine if it can raise the funds to purchase the property and submit a bid to purchase it. The ACV applies to the building and not the business.

The Council fully acknowledges the inclusion of the facility within the Neighbourhood Plan and recognises its status as a valuable asset to the village and residents. Having discussed the issue at length, and having considered a written representation from a resident, the Council resolved not to submit an application to Leeds City Council for the building to be listed as an ACV. The Council considers that there is no simple answer as to whether registration as an ACV would be beneficial or detrimental or indeed a mixture of both to the future of the Shop/Post

Office. The Council would not be in a financial position to proceed either to purchase the building or subsequently run/manage the business if it were put up for sale.

Other Community Groups within the village, including charities and unincorporated groups of at least 21 members, have the right to make an application to register a building as an ACV. The final outcome of the discussion was that the Council is arranging an open **Parish Meeting at the Pavilion on January 18th at 7.00pm, to which everyone is invited and especially to those who would wish to have their say on this issue, so that the matter can be openly discussed and if deemed appropriate a Community Group with a specific remit be established.**

In the interim, Council will try to keep everyone informed via the Parish Council website as information becomes available.

Rebuild of the Bramham Parish Centre, progress update: *The build programme has had some slippage due to the freezing weather but with the weather predicted to improve it is expected that APT will catch up, especially once the roof is tiled and the building watertight. Essential information will be posted on the Parish Council website as it becomes available.*

Pavilion and Playing Field & Broadband: Council agreed to conduct the enabling works as soon as the football season has finished and the pitches can be crossed without the possibility of leaving an uneven surface, creating a trip hazard.

5 Star, having increased their number of sessions on a Saturday and Clifford Football Club starting to play on the second pitch on a Saturday morning at 11.00am the traffic situation is being closely watched to minimise inconvenience to surrounding residential property owners.

Bramham House Development: To date the Application process by the developer to discharge the Full Planning Permission Conditions is ongoing. Residents wishing to read any of the submissions can do so by going online to the LCC Planning Portal and using the reference 22/06207/COND to access the documents.

Dog Walking: Having had no offers to sponsor the disposable bags the Parish Council will continue replenishing the four dispensers until further notice. Should anyone wish to sponsor some of the bags could they please contact Nancy Fairbairn at clerk@bramhamparishcouncil.gov.uk

Defibrillator training: Now that the third defibrillator is sited on the gable end of the pavilion a training session will be held at the pavilion in the New Year and all will be welcome (including all the football trainers). I have been in contact with the lead trainer at WYMAS for a number of months and further details will follow once the backlog following the Covid restrictions has been cleared. It is unlikely that the session can be arranged before March/April.

The next meeting will take place at 7.00pm in Bramham Pavilion on Wednesday 11th January 2023. Wishing you all a very Happy Christmas and prosperous New Year.

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Bramham Community Fund

The Bramham Community Fund exists to distribute the money generated by Festival Republic from the sale of residents' tickets at the Leeds Festival together with other donations made directly by the promoter. The requirement is that funds are to be used for the benefit of the community of Bramham.

Since the Leeds Festival moved to Bramham in 2003, the Fund has allocated grants to a value of over £440,000.

The last allocation of grants, took place in March 2022. It is planned that the allocations from the 2022 Festival will be considered in March 2023. The Fund is therefore now inviting applications.

The closing date is 14 February 2023

To keep it simple, there is no formal application form. Just write to the Bramham Community Fund **c/o Colin Pool at 7 Prospect Bank, Bramham, LS23 6RS or send an email to colin.pool@empiconsulting.co.uk**

saying what you would like a grant for, how much and why. The Fund committee under the chairmanship of Nick Lane Fox will then meet to consider the applications.

Proposed projects should normally be completed within one year of the grant being awarded. If a project is expected to exceed that timescale, the application should indicate as such. You should be aware that in the past preference in the allocation of grants has been given to new projects rather than funding the ongoing support of existing activities.

Applications cannot be accepted from individuals, commercial organisations or for projects which do not directly benefit residents of Bramham.

Happy New Year to you all! Its great to have the opportunity to pause and reflect on the past year, its so encouraging to see what God has been doing!

At the beginning on 2022 Café Church was very much in its infancy with on average 10 people coming each week, fast forward to December 2022 and we have just had over 40 people attend the most recent Saturday including 9 Children!

An example of this was as things started to get busier, we were struggling with the coffee machines we had, we couldn’t keep the coffee warm but wanted to serve fresh coffee. We have had times of illness or no one to help in the kitchen some weeks and at the last minute someone always steps in.

It has also been great to see a team form in the running of Café church, there are so many important roles in the running of it, baking, prayer, washing up, setting up, tidying away and as we have grown we need even more of a team! We now have children regularly attending and like to prepare a craft activity each week, we also meet afterwards for a short time of prayer which we are hoping people will take turns in leading. Clergy Letter for January

January is a time of new starts. We've had a lot of these lately, when you think about it. There was a sense of a fresh start after various phases of Covid lockdowns. We have had a succession of Prime Ministers in recent years, each promising some kind of fresh start. Whether any of these fresh starts deliver what we hope will vary with different people's experience and expectations, of course, but in the Church year (that is, the liturgical year - the way that Christians vary their focus on the significance of various insights into who Jesus is, and what he did, and how that ought to affect how we live today, and how we understand life, the universe and everything) we are in a season of The New.



This continues to be the Christmas season, right up until February 2nd, a season when the Church focuses on the birth of Jesus in terms of God doing something new. In the birth of Jesus, we see the offer of a fresh start for humanity. We see God revealed in the most relateable form possible for us humans: as a human like us. We see that holiness, goodness and love are not unattainable, impossible dreams for mere humans, but that God meets us in the mire and mess of the world, mucks in alongside us and shows us what is humanly possible.

OK, we still get things wrong. To err is human. But every day, we have the opportunity for a fresh start with God. The prayer Jesus taught his friends puts it best: - we are called to aspire to God's holiness

(our Father who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name),

- to seek things on earth to be like they are in heaven (thy kingdom come, thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven),

- to rely on God's resources when we don't feel up to the job (give us this day our daily bread)

- to recognize that we're not perfect, and nor is anyone else, so let's forgive the imperfections of others as well as seeking forgiveness when we've messed up (and forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us),

- to ask God to keep us on the straight and narrow, and safe from what harms us (and lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil).

Praying The Lord's Prayer as we start each day is one way we can see each day as a fresh start. Be kind to yourself and to others, and as a new year with fresh challenges rises up to meet us, may our community grow in love, in joy, in peacefulness, in patience, in kindness, in goodness, in faithfulness, in gentleness, and in self-control. Amen

Wetherby in Support of the Elderly (WiSE) is appealing for needs kind-hearted residents with time on their hands to help launch a brand new memory café.

WiSE wants volunteers willing to spare six hours a month to help those living with dementia at the café, which aims to create a friendly, safe and supportive space for people living with dementia and their carers.

WiSE dementia coordinator Emma will oversee the running of the café. She said: "Re-establishing dementia support from WiSE in Wetherby is such an important step for us as a charity and we'd love for more volunteers to come forward to help us on this journey.

"We're looking for people who are friendly, caring and enjoy being around people. You might have had experience of supporting someone with dementia in the past, but this is by no means essential as training will be provided.



"Most importantly of all you will be willing to throw yourselves into activities including everything from art sessions to singing in a group."

The new memory café will meet twice a month on Wednesdays, 1.30pm to 3.30pm at St James' Church in Wetherby.

It will support those living with dementia and their carers by providing an appropriate setting to focus on clients' wellbeing, with sessions facilitated by a trained staff member, alongside WiSE's volunteers. Support and advice will also be offered to family carers to assist them in their day-to-day continuing and challenging caring role.

Funding for the café has come from multiple sources, including the National Lottery Awards For All and McCarthy Stone Foundation.

Church leaders in Ukraine have expressed their doubts about any meaningful peace talks with Russia, after a fresh wave of missile strikes in recent weeks.

The primate of Ukraine's independent Orthodox Church, Metropolitan Epiphany (Dumenko) said: "Our continuing struggle will certainly be crowned with success with God's help – we are fighting for our homeland's liberation, our own existence, and our children's futures. It should also be clearly understood that this struggle isn't just physical, but also spiritual. It cannot be that the body of our state is Ukrainian, while its spirit is Russian.



The Franciscan RC bishop of Odesa, the Rt Revd Stanislav Shyrokoradiuk, said that "although pressure is being exerted on us to negotiate and cede territory, our government and armed services will not agree to this; we've already suffered too much, while everyone knows any concessions will merely fuel further demands."

Churches in Ukraine recently staged a Day of Prayer for Orphans, as aid agencies warn that the destruction of power and water supplies could drive a whole new flood of refugees westwards.
