This info guide has been prepared to give you advance notice of some of the details of the event including temporary traffic restrictions and routes, operating times and ways to contact the event and partner agencies before, during and after the event. Dear Residents & Local businesses,

I am writing to confirm our plans for Leeds Festival 2025.

- The dates of the festival are the 22nd, 23rd and 24th of August, with entertainment for those camping starting on Wednesday 20th.
- Traffic will start arriving from Wednesday 20th August and will leave on Monday 25th August 2025.

Below are details of plans developed with Leeds City Council, West Yorkshire Police, Yorkshire Ambulance Service and other statutory bodies.

Festival Republic aim to continually to reduce issues faced by local residents over the events and have been working closely with the local community year round.

Residents information line, community response & contact details

If you have any questions or concerns leading up to, during, or after the event please don't hesitate to contact us on the residents hotline number 02080801400.

We have set up the resident hotline for local residents and businesses to connect us directly with our onsite Licensing Office during the festival if required.

Our operators will take details of the request / complaint and contact the appropriate department or contractor to action a response and you will be given a unique reference number.

Noise

If you have a complaint about noise or any other issue you should call our hotline number to register the complaint. Noise levels are regulated and monitored by our onsite acoustic consultants and Environmental Health at Leeds City Council.

The hours of entertainment are:

- Thursday 21st August – 7pm to 3am
- Friday 22nd August – 12pm to 6am
- Saturday 23rd August – 12pm to 6am
- Sunday 24th August – 12pm to 6am

On Friday, Saturday & Sunday, the main entertainment will finish at 11pm. From 11pm to 3am, there will be entertainment from DJs on the LS23 Stage. From 11pm and with staggered finish times until 6am, there will be entertainment from DJs on the Piccadilly Party stage.

In addition, there may be some sound checks. These are limited in duration to 2 hours and limited in scheduling to either Wednesday to Sunday. Times of sound checks and rehearsals are agreed in advance with Leeds City Council. Sound checks and rehearsals will not take place on any other day.

Please note that low level recorded music will be played once gates open until the first act comes on stage.

Traffic plans on event days

Please allow extra time for your journey during peak times. Please plan your respective journeys and follow the instructions posted and any additional signage as well.

We hope the advance notice of the traffic restrictions and event traffic routes will enable you to plan your journeys and allow you to notify visiting family members, friends and customers. Please read the following information carefully. The festival Traffic Management Plan is largely the same as last year.

There are three key routes for festival traffic:

Red Route - all Pick Up Drop Off (PUDO) traffic arriving and departing

The one-way system on the A64 will be in place for the duration of the festival. From 04:00hrs on Wednesday 20th August to 15:00hrs on Monday 25th August, the A64 between the Fox and Grapes public house and the A1(M) / A64 roundabout will be closed to all traffic travelling Eastbound (i.e. from Leeds to York). The closure turning point will be at the red-bus layby as in previous years. Please note we will take the closures off as soon as possible.

This closure period has again been agreed with Leeds City Council, as the East Leeds Orbital Route (ELOR) can be used as a diversion for local traffic.

PUDO Festival Traffic will follow the red route that starts on the A1(M) and requires all traffic to exit via Jct 44 and join York Road (A64) Westbound. Traffic will then enter the site on a right turn into Red Gate 2/Red Gate 1.

Bus routes travelling along the A64 eastbound from Seacroft to the A1(M) A64 roundabout will be diverted. For up to date information, please contact Metro www.wymetro.com or telephone **0113 245 7676**

As in previous years, Kiddal Lane at the junction with the A64 / York Road and Potterton Lane at the junction with Kiddal Lane will be closed from Wednesday 20th August to Monday 25th August.

Alternative route for residents

If you would normally use the A64 Eastbound to travel back to Thorner village, please use the A64 Eastbound from Seacroft to the ELOR junction. Follow the ELOR towards the A58 roundabout with Skeltons Lane and access Thorner via Skeltons Lane.

Alternatively you can access Thorner via the A58.

Recommended routes in order to avoid the main festival traffic from Thorner village to the A1(M):

Carr Lane to the A58, direction Wetherby – to either junction 45 or 46

Skeltons Lane to the ELOR, then M1 South/North.

Brown Route – all car parking travelling from the South (Northbound on A1(M) via Jct 45)

Festival car parking traffic will travel from the south up the A1(M) and will be signed via Jct 45 to Grange Moor / Wattle Syke roundabouts and then South on West Woods Road to Thorner Road, left on Thorner Road and then right onto Paradise Way and into site on a left turn into Brown Gate. This route will be used throughout, with particularly heavy traffic on Wednesday 20th August, Thursday 21st August, and the morning of Friday 22nd August. This traffic will be travelling one way in.

From 9pm Sunday 24th August, this route reverses as festival goers leave along the same route but in the opposite direction. This traffic will be travelling one way out and Monday morning will be another peak period.

White Route - all car parking travelling from the North (Southbound on A1(M) via Jct 44).

Weekend and Day customers parking at the festival will travel from the north down the A1(M) and will be signed via Jct 44 roundabout to go north up Paradise Way. Traffic will then enter the festival on a left turn into White Gate. This route will be used throughout, with particularly heavy traffic on Wednesday 20th August, Thursday 21st August, and the morning of Friday 22nd August. This traffic will be travelling one way in.

Between 2100hrs and 0600hrs on Friday 22nd August & Saturday 23rd August and from 2100hrs on Sunday 24th August until egress is complete on Monday 25th August, this route reverses as festival goers leave along the same route but in the opposite direction. This traffic will be travelling one way out and Monday morning will be another peak period.

Aberford Village Closures

We are closing Aberford Road (Main Street) at its junction with Bramham Interchange (Jct 44) and its junction with the A1(M) underpass for the duration of the festival, from Wednesday 20th to Monday 25th August. There will be no access for road users, including residents, down this road.

Alternative routes for residents

If you need to access the A1(M) and want to avoid the festival traffic, from Wednesday 20th August to Sunday 24th August, then we would suggest travelling along Thorner Road, turning left on West Woods Road and travelling north to access the A1(M) at Wattle Syke.

During the morning of Monday 25th August, exit Thorner via Skeltons Lane, join ELOR, turn right on to the A58 and join the A1(M).

Other temporary traffic regulation orders

Some other restrictions are in place in addition to those outlined above and are detailed below. These apply throughout the festival period (Wednesday 20th August to Monday 25th August) unless otherwise stated:

- The closure of Westwoods Road at its junction with Wattle Syke for Southbound traffic between 2100 and 0300 on Friday 22nd August & Saturday 23rd August, and between 2100 on Sunday 24th August and 2100 on Monday 25th August. During these times, access to Bramham from A58/Wetherby/J45 will need to be via Boston Spa. There are several routes available but we suggest using Clifford Moor Road.
- The closure of the bridge over the A1 (M) that leads to Bowcliffe Hall and Bramham Park other than for residents and business'
- Paradise Way will be closed from the junction with Thorner Road to the junction with Milnthorpe Lane for the duration of the festival. This is to prevent the use of Bramham village as a cut through by festival traffic seeking to loop through the village to Thorner Road.
- **30mph speed limit and no U- turns on the following roads:**
 - along Bramham and Thorner Road from the junction with Kirkfield Avenue to the Bramham bypass / Paradise Way
 - West Woods Road from Wattle Syke to Thorner Road
 - Bramham bypass from Thorner Road along Paradise Way and Spen Common Lane to the A1(M) / A64 roundabout
 - A64 York Road from the A1(M) / A64 roundabout to Thorner Lane.
- No stopping (clearways) on the following roads:
 - West Woods Road from Wattle Syke to Thorner Road
 - Thorner Road bridge over A1(M)
 - Bramham Bypass from Thorner Road along Paradise Way and Spen Common Lane to the A1(M) / A64 roundabout
 - A64 York Road from the A1(M) / A64 roundabout to Thorner Lane

Please note that West Yorkshire Police will be deploying **mobile speed cameras throughout the roads leading to the festival site. All speed limits must be adhered to.**

Traffic Management Plan

A full and very detailed Traffic Management Plan including full details of all signage, routings, access and exiting strategies etc. has been supplied and approved by all relevant agencies as part of the licensing process. Meetings and consultation about the traffic plan with these agencies are ongoing.

Footpath Closures

We have again applied to Leeds City Council to temporarily close the following footpaths:

Footpath numbers 12, 13 and 30 - these run through Bramham Park Estate and we are therefore applying to close them during the period of the build and load out of the infrastructure as well as the festival itself. The closure dates applied for are Monday 11th August to Friday 29th August.

Mangrill Lane bridleway number 33 for all users from the junction of Mangrill Lane and footpath 16 to the junction with Thorner Road and for cyclists and equestrians from the junction with the A64 to the junction with Thorner Road. The closure dates applied for are Friday 15th August – Friday 29th August.

We realise that the road closures and the one-way system may mean a longer journey time for you and I would like to thank you in advance for bearing with us, it is very much appreciated.

Travelling to and from the festival

Residents' Shuttle Bus

There is no pedestrian access to the festival site and Bramham Parish Council and Festival Republic strongly advise against walking along the A64 to attend or leave the festival. Bramham Community Fund will again be organising a free shuttle bus service for resident ticket holders from the festival bus station onsite at the Purple Gate, off Thorner Road. Please make use of this service. Festival Republic will liaise with Bramham Community Fund to confirm the designated route to and from the festival site.

Residents' Car Park

The car park for local residents that are attending the festival is accessible via Purple Gate. This will be signposted from Thorner Road and will again be shared with cars of guest ticket holders. This is also the place to drop off and pick up Bramham residents attending the festival.

Trespass / Security / Environmental Problems / Unauthorised Camping

The public parts of the festival site (which comprise the main entertainment arena, the campsites and the car parks) are well away from all residential areas. Although there have been no significant problems with trespass in the past, if someone should trespass on your land, then please call the Police in the first instance. If necessary, our security staff will be available to assist them.

We will again have an on-site supermarket and there will also be various stalls onsite. We will advertise these facilities onsite and in the advance publicity. While we are not able to prevent people from accessing public highways or keep them onsite, we feel confident that the above measures will mean we have done much to reduce the need for people to go into local villages. There are a very significant number of stewards and security on and around the site, some of whom can be redeployed offsite if necessary in cooperation with and in support of the Police.

The residents' car park and guest / local resident campsite will open at 2pm on Wednesday 20th August but there will be no access into the entertainment arena until it opens at around 7pm on Thursday 21st August. The guest check in will be open until 9pm on Wednesday 20th August and from 9am – 9pm Thursday 21st to Sunday 24th August.
