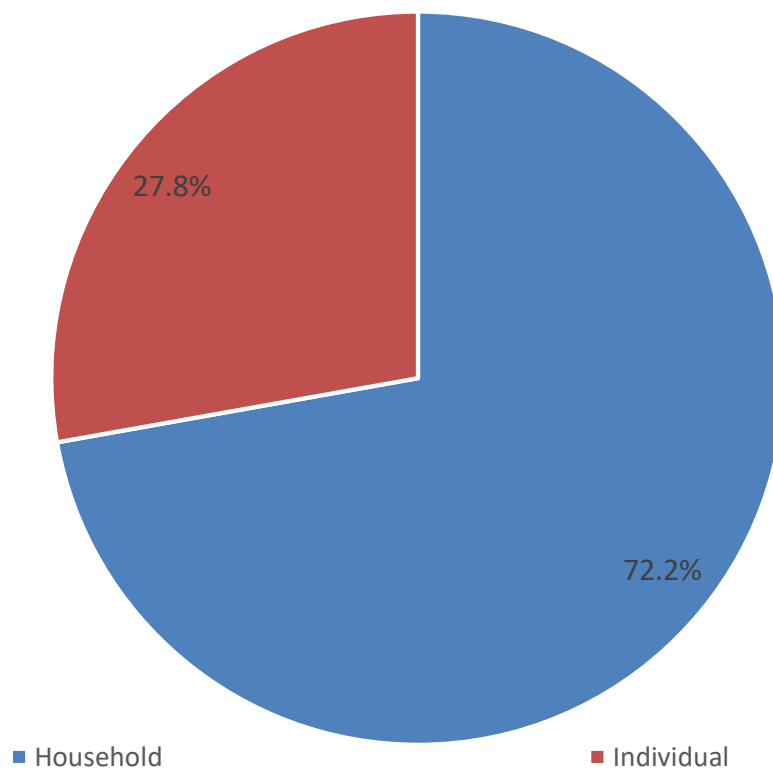

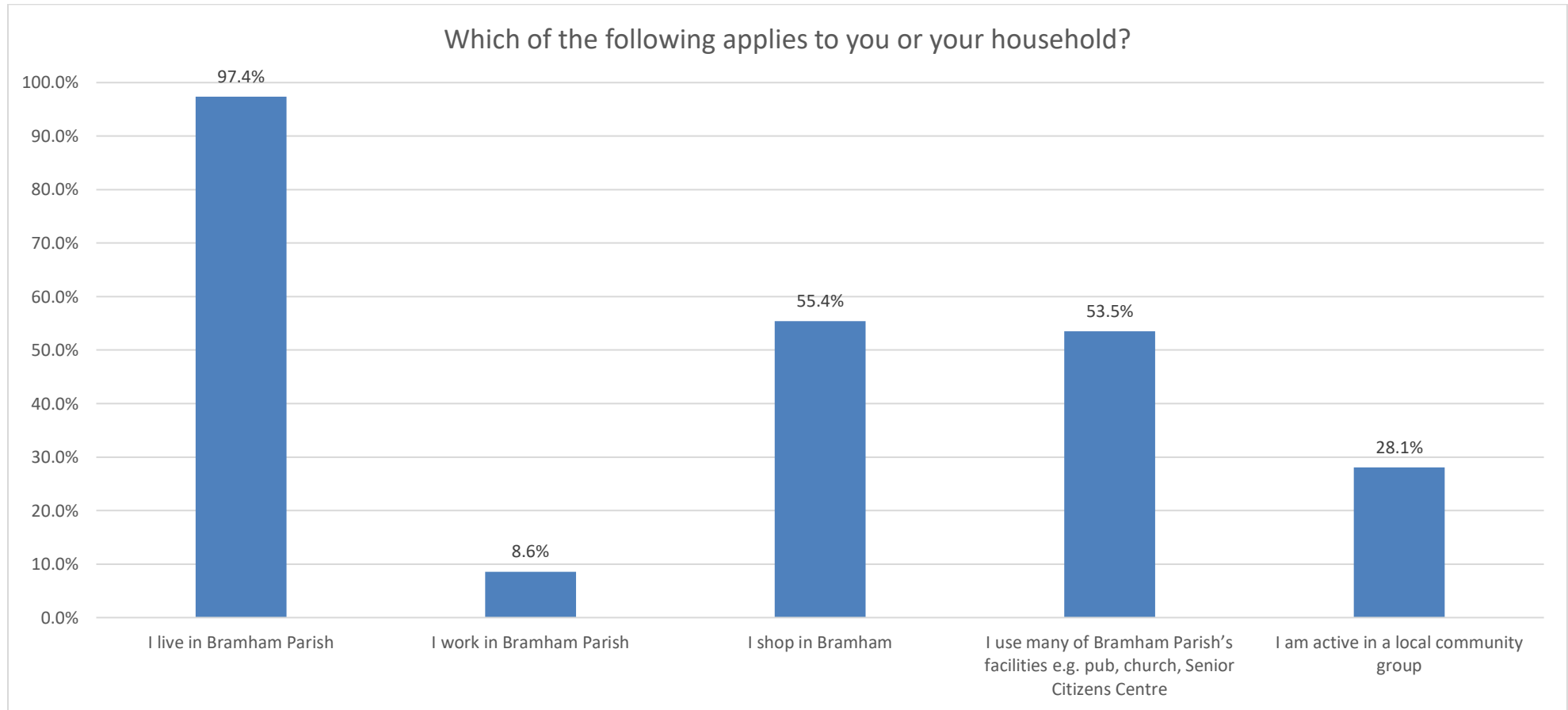

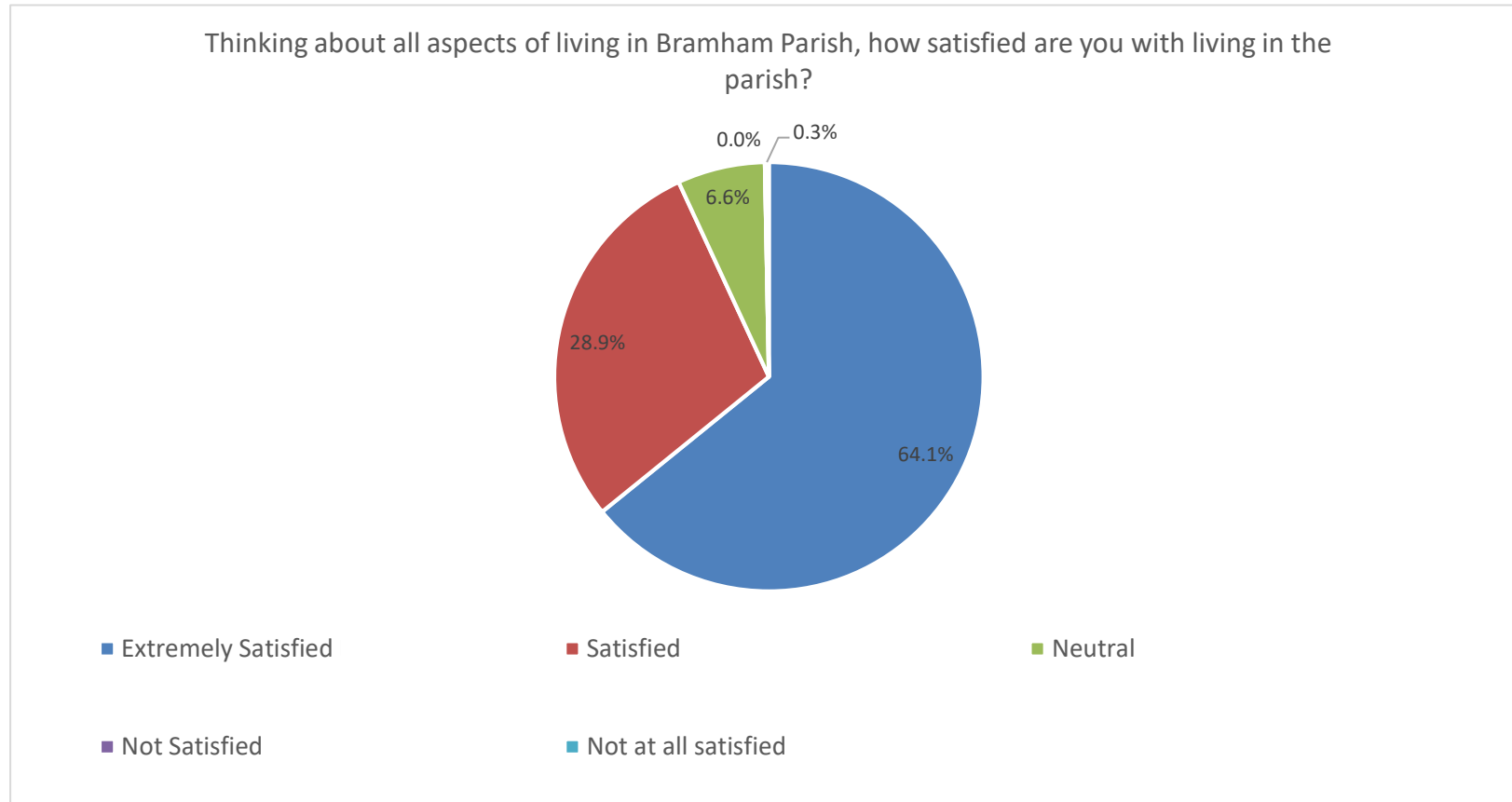

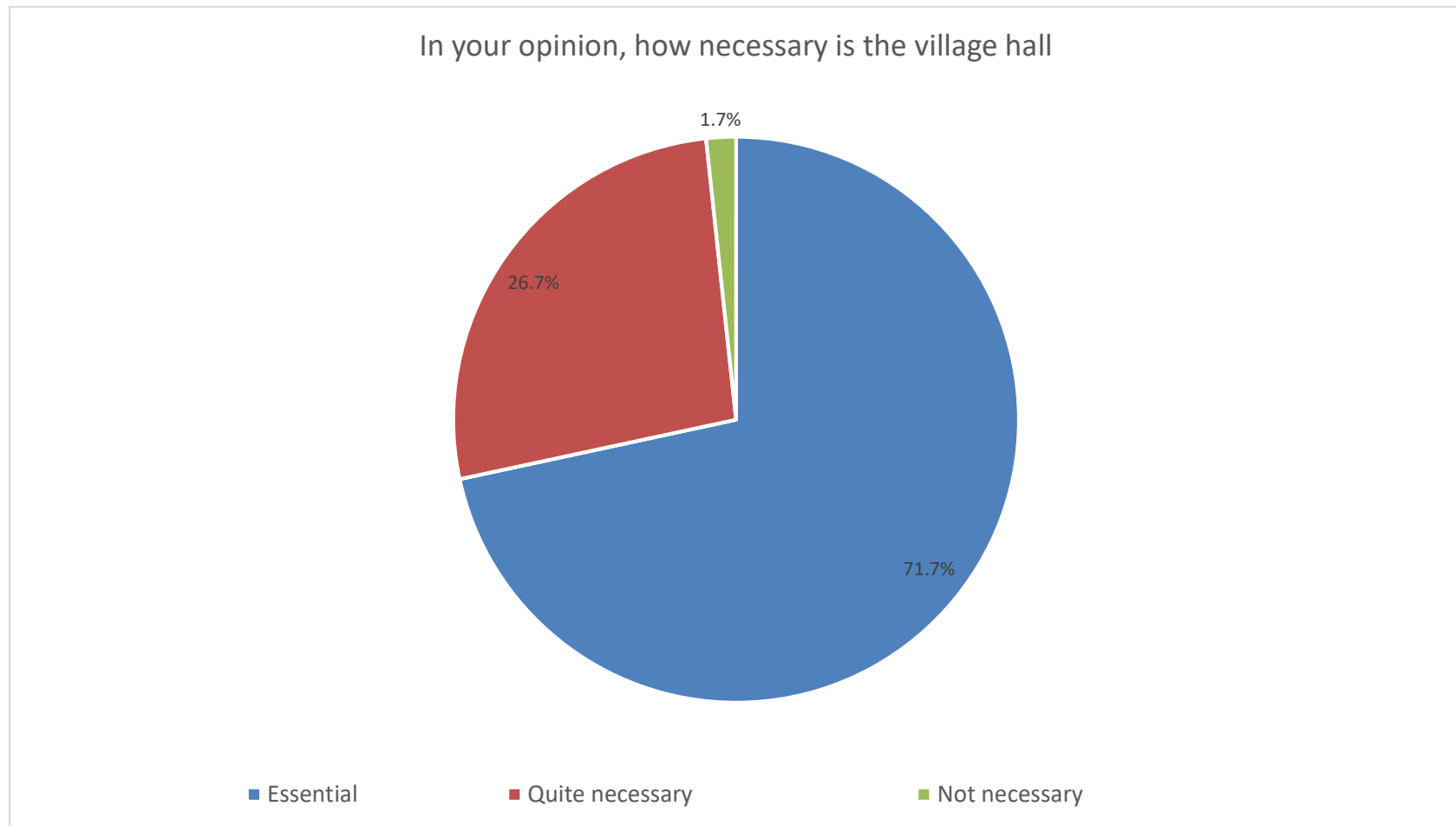

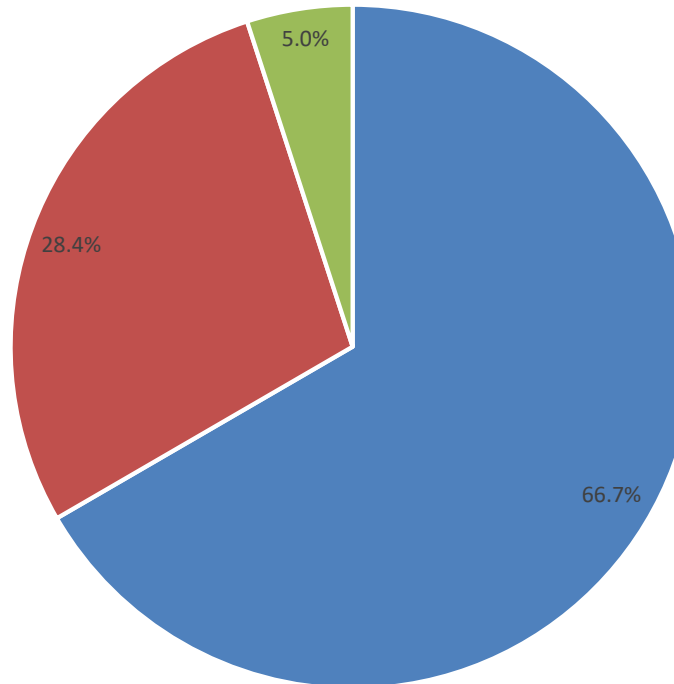

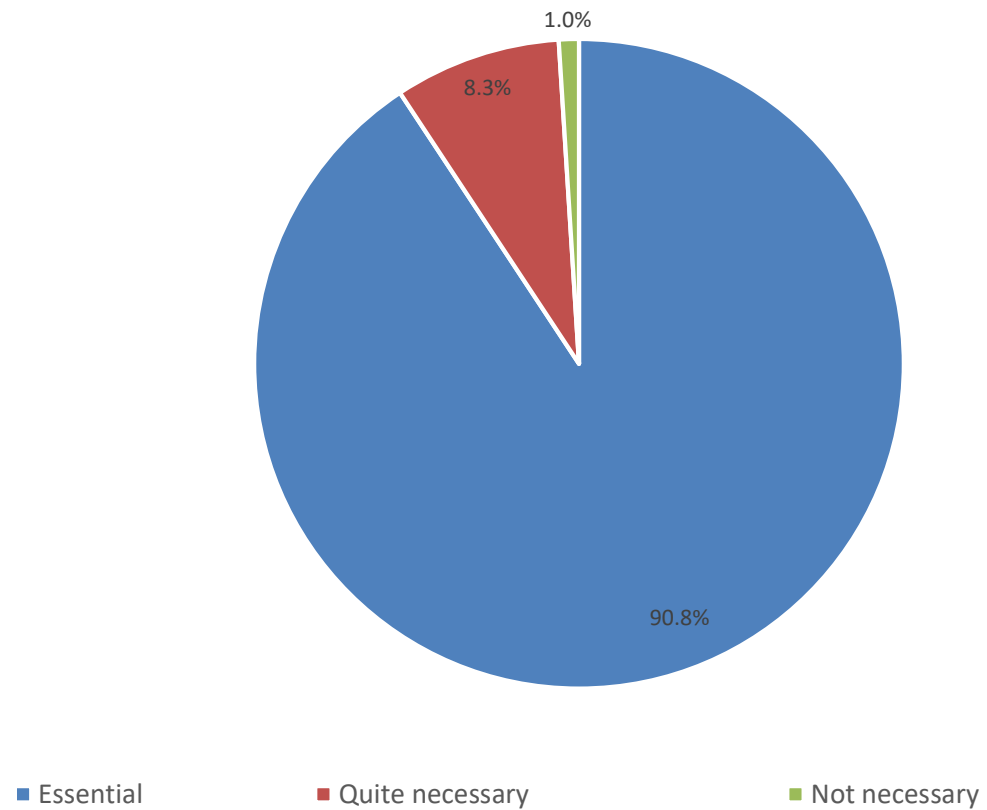

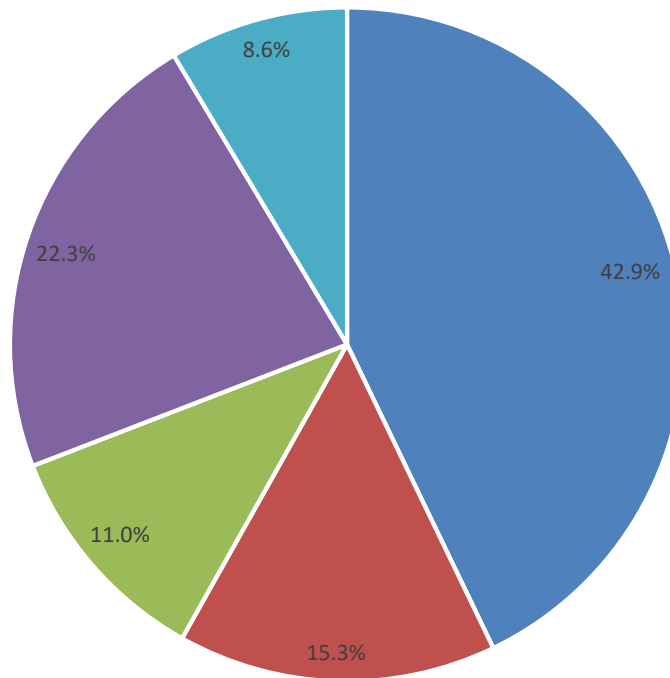

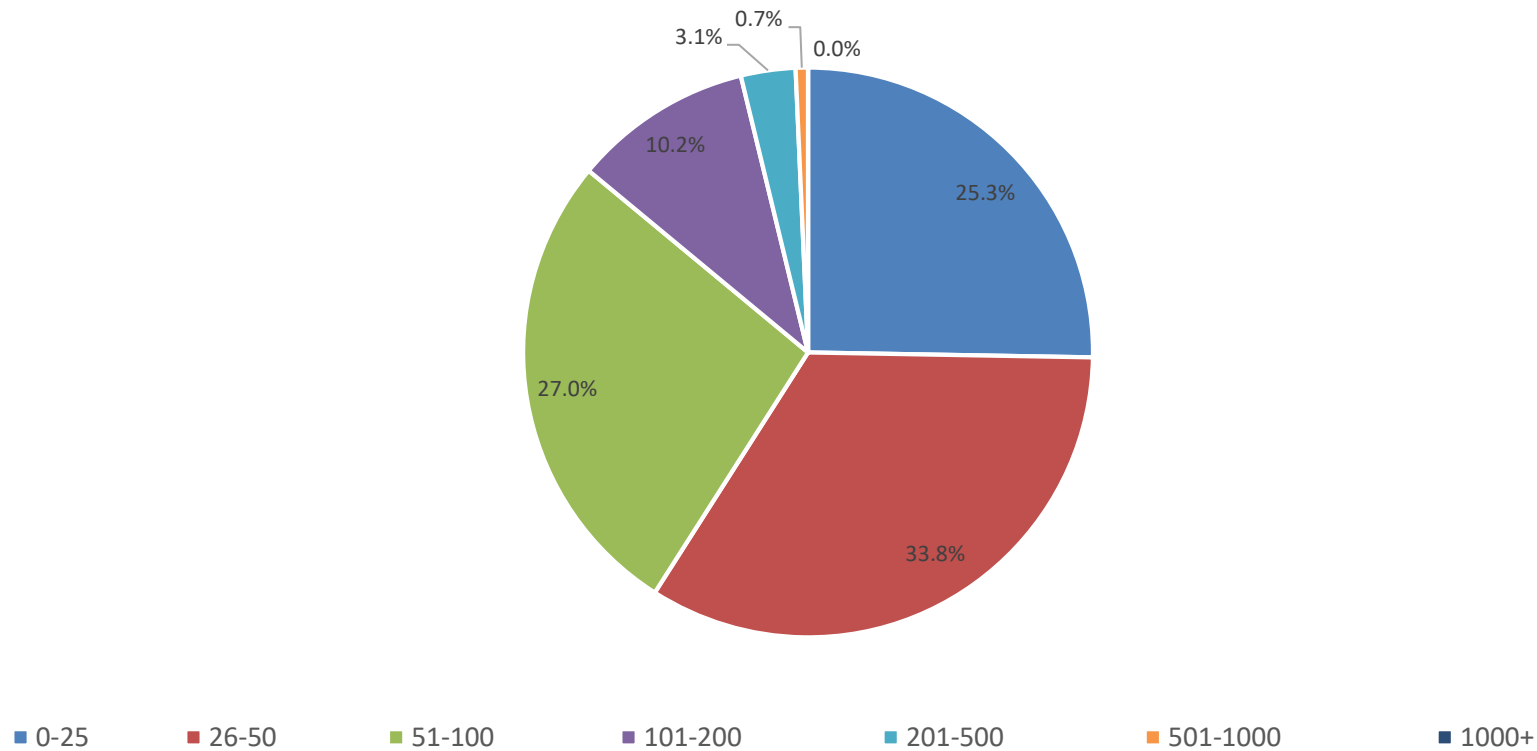

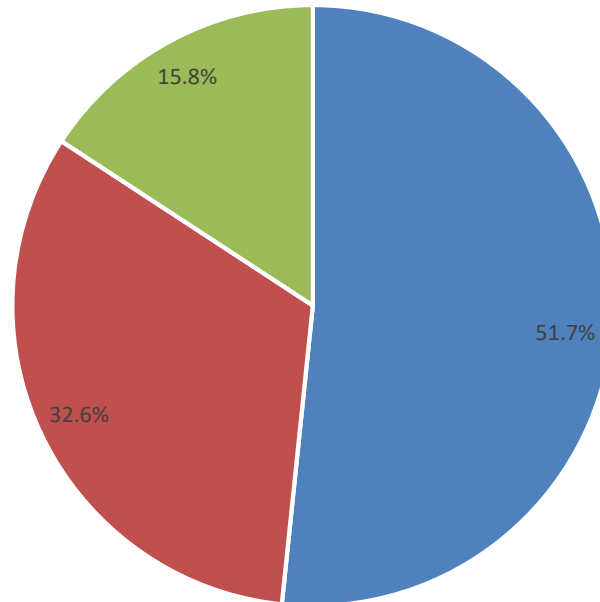

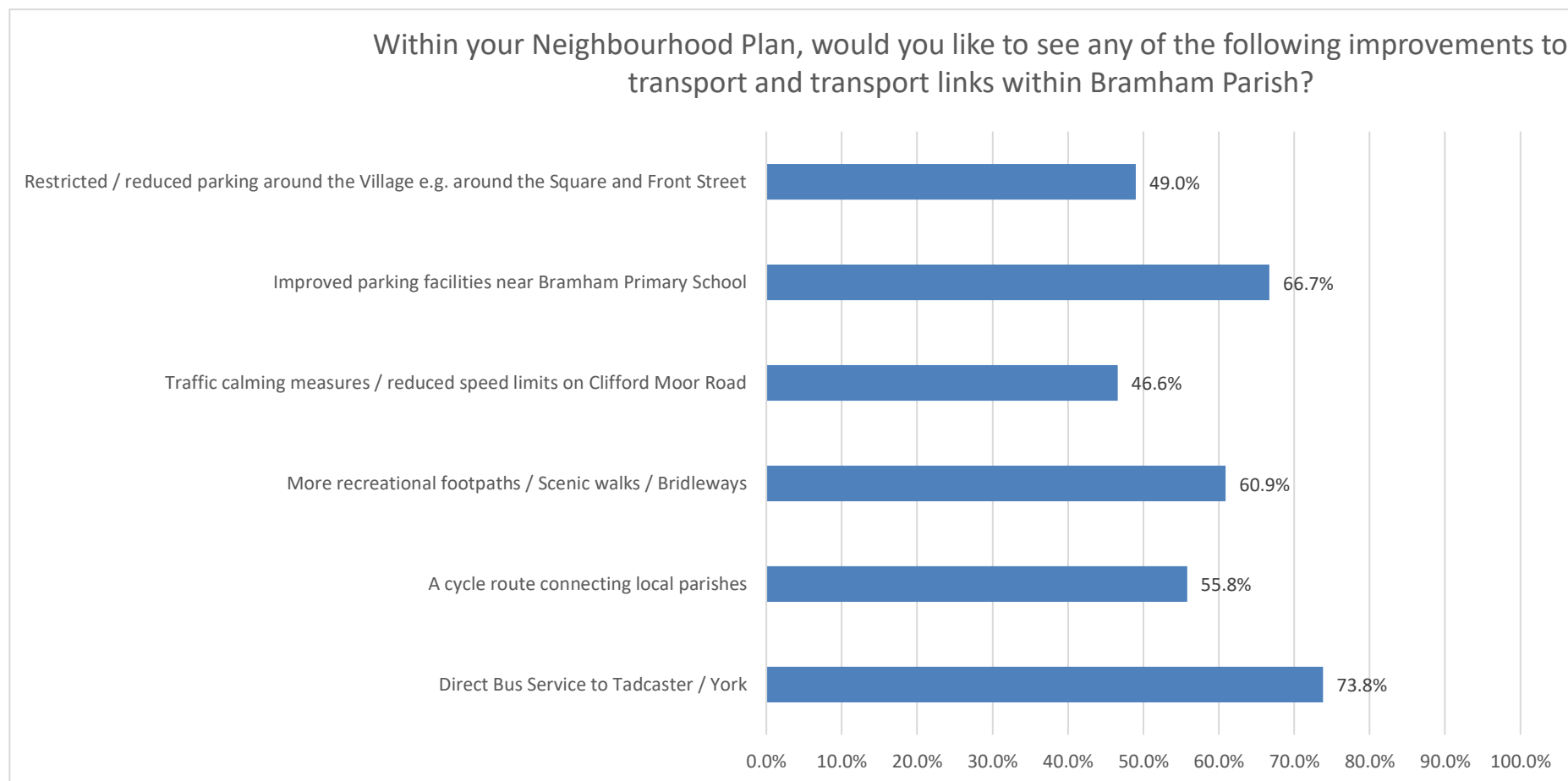

Q17 Within your Neighbourhood Plan, would you like to see any of the following improvements to transport and transport links within Bramham Parish?

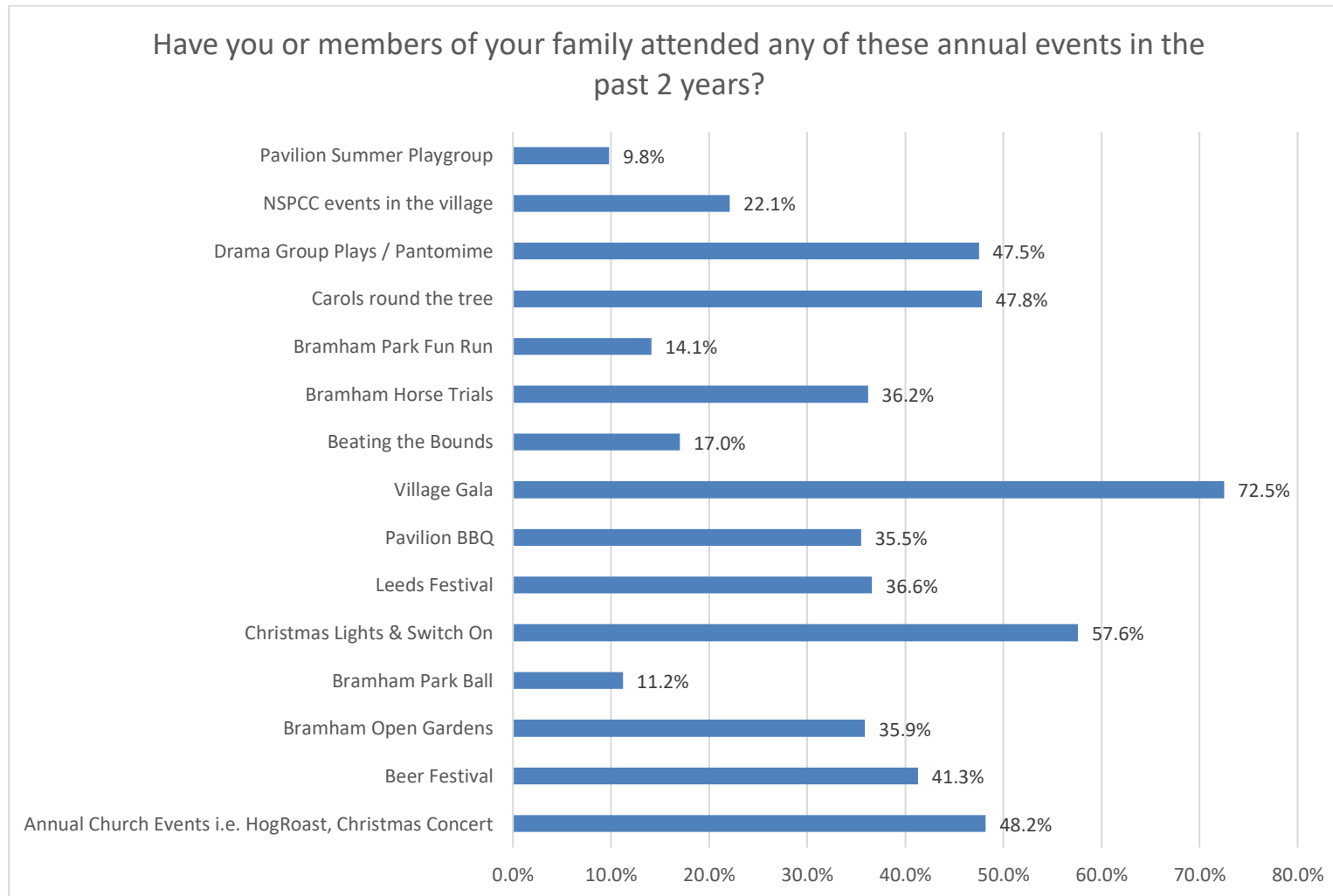

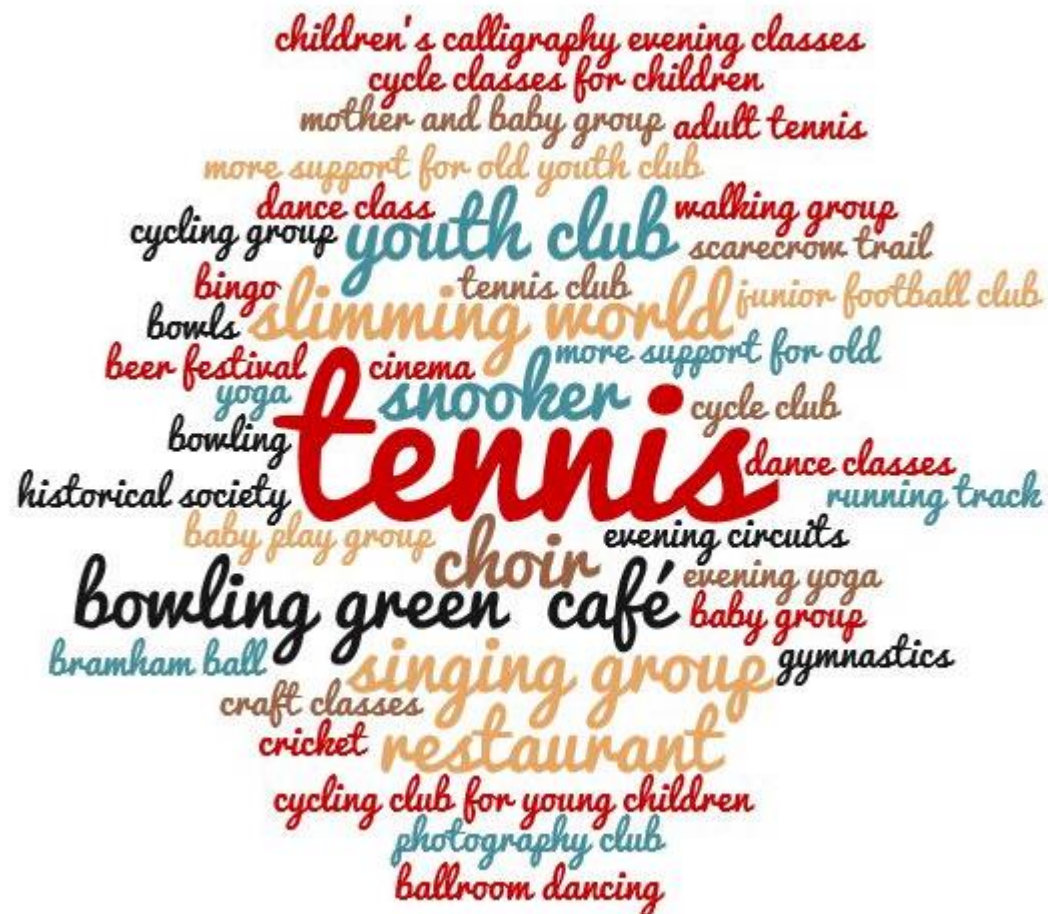

The playground isn't exciting enough for older children

Village café to appeal to older age group

Would be great to see a better offering at the shop as fresh local produce, nicer range of food - a farm shop. We would also love a small bar/restaurant. Or encourage more pop up restaurants.

Not sure if brownies/cubs/guides/scouts/ventures etc are held in village now.

Not many recreational/social activities

More authentic home produced food in say red-lion and village shop. Good pie - hot and cold in top pub - "blues" evening (acoustic), a weekly deli-stall in the village square - recycling facilities at the pavillion (with cctv protection)

Children are "taken" to activities outside the village. It may be possible to provide transport to make accessibility to specialist facilities.

Don't think scouts and brownies now exist in the village. No youth club facilities that I know of.

Now the children's centre has stopped the toddler group at Bramham primary there are no groups for new (or non-working) parents to meet in the village. This group was fantastic - it's a big loss to the village. Am pleased my daughter is now at school.

Lots of groups young teenagers roam the village with nothing to do

We need volunteers who are prepared to start clubs or organise events for this age group - an age group probably neglected to some extent in the village

Something for 13-17 may be required, but the uniformed group do provide this

I am not sure but presume 13-17 year olds would benefit maybe from a youth club/band practice facility as sitting on the children's playground surely isn't enough.

Running track could help here or dodgeball club

Needs to be more activities suitable to get children out and playing and meeting others. Not just beavers/brownies etc

Are there currently all of the following brownies, guides, cubs, scouts, youth club

A youth club would be a good idea but it is a huge commitment and has to be tried

Appreciate Bramham is one of smaller villages in area but couple more amenities would help above age groups. Also a pub with child friendly play area/grass area could be a benefit

Playground area near a1 too close no youth club/scouts/guides in the village - only Clifford groups - nothing when these finish at 14 years old

13 - 17 yrs with more things to do would cause less vandalism

There used to be roller disco, youth club, brownies, scouts etc. Not sure what is available now.

Would be nice to have more upper body gym equipment on the playing fields

Not sure what is available to older teenagers other than the park

Feels a little isolated - good bus service would help

Village cafe to appeal to older age group

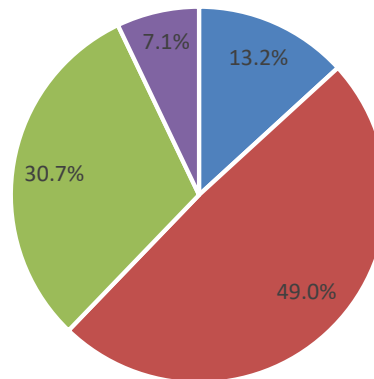

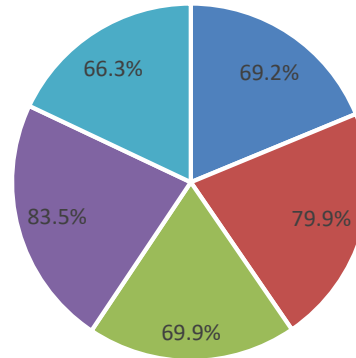

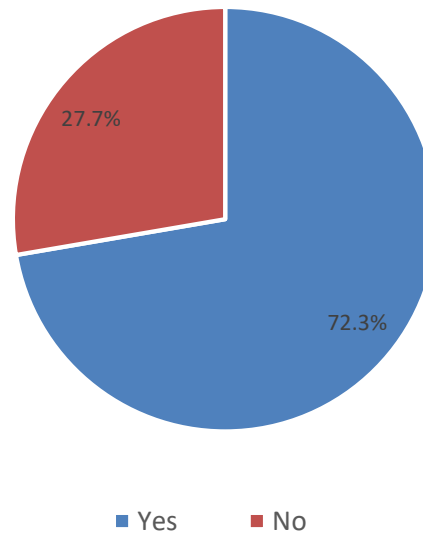

Inconvenient and dangerous parking of cars on pavement at garage on a daily basis. Also doctors and Front Street makes accessing Clifford Road and Front Street dangerous.

Too many parked cars outside garage, High Street and Front Street.

The major issue effecting the quality of life in the village is the noise from the A1/M. Any improvement to this would be a major benefit

Footpath/bridlepath/cycleway through Bramham Estate - from Bowcliffe Hall / Woodyard to Mangrill Lane.

Footpaths on Bramham Estate - make them permissive.

People make the needs of pedestrians a priority. These are the most vulnerable in our community - the young, old or disabled. Parking outside your house is difficult.

It is unsafe/impossible to manoeuvre around Bramham on foot without having to step into the road.
