WORKING GROUP - TRAFFIC MANAGEMENT

Briefing minutes of the meeting held by Zoom on 22nd February 2021 at 7.30pm

Present: Cllr M Corrigan, Cllr S Jones & Cllr L Richards

Bin-Stickers:

- The extra 650 bin stickers have been ordered and are awaited.
- The accompanying letter has been agreed and will be printed.
- Cllr. LR will contact Gillian Lawson to seek a copy of the regional map of Bramham used for the distribution of the Parish Magazine. The stickers will then be distributed by the WG.

Mobile SID:

- The application to the Community Fund has been submitted and the outcome is awaited.
- Confirmation is awaited from Clifford Parish Council that they would be agreeable to part-fund the SID.
- Three quotes had been received (attached in spreadsheet) and the WG's recommendation to Council is to purchase the "Viasis Smile Plus" from Mallatite Limited. It has the advantage that the data system is the same as the static SIDs used by LCC Highways, they being manufactured by the same company "via traffic controlling" based in Germany.
- The WG is seeking permission from Council to create a database of residents willing to participate in the manning of the unit, this to be done through a further article both on the website and in the Parish Magazine.
- Cllr. LR agreed to ask the NPT if they would advise on the ideal sites for positioning the SID prior to the exercise being launched.
- We have received confirmation from the NPT that we would be acting legally by deploying the unit providing we did not obstruct users of the footpath, any signage and did not record any vehicular details which might identify the vehicle/owner/driver. It has also been confirmed that the data could not be used against any individual vehicle/driver.
- Cllr SJ offered to source some hi-vis vests/jackets with a suitable logo on the back, which will have to be agreed.

Static SID on Clifford Road:

- Highways have agreed to send the disc/dongle and instructions so that we can access the data; this is awaited.
- We are awaiting an indicative cost to repair the damage but as the SID continues to work it might not be cost effective at present.

NPT Traffic monitoring:

- Cllr. LR reported that during a recent exercise on Bowcliffe Road 3 vehicles were stopped and warned that they had been exceeding the limit.

AOB:

- We are still awaiting a response from Nick Borrás to the letter sent in December and the reminder in January 4 weeks ago. Cllr. MC agreed to write to Nick Borrás again.
